## All English Minors are required to complete 24 hours in English

<u>Two</u> first-year English courses ENG 1310 – College Writing I ENG 1320 – College Writing II

<u>Two</u> sophomore literature courses\* ENG 2310, 2320, 2330, 2340, 2359, *or* 2360.

\*No more than 6 hours of sophomore literature count toward the minor. Minors who earn at least a B in their first sophomore course have the option to enroll in an advanced literature course in place of the second sophomore course.

**Four** advanced courses. At least two different groups must be represented on the student's degree outline.
