- ID curriculum is accredited by Council for Interior Design Accreditation (CIDA)
- In the absence of high school language, 2 semesters of the same language must be taken at the college level
- It is strongly suggested that students consider transferring into the program prior to meeting all general education core curriculum requirements or course options may be limited. The completion of ID major course requirements alone requires a minimum of seven semesters due to strict sequencing, regardless of other credit hours accumulated
- **Students will not receive general education core curriculum credit for both CHEM 1310 and CHEM 1341
- **Students will not receive general education core curriculum credit for both PHYS 1325 and PHYS 2425
- Majors must pass all required Interior Design, Art, and Technology classes with a grade of "C" or higher. Any student
 making a grade of "D" or lower in ID, ART, or CSM courses may not proceed to the next level course until a grade of "C" or
 higher is achieved
