Please complete all parts of the attached application forms. You will need to submit two letters of recommendation, a resume, and a short essay, to the Graduate College, before your application can be processed. We also ask for an official transcript, sent to the Graduate College. The GRE is not required. A degree in history is not required.

Students applying to the certificate program are admitted through the Graduate College. Students must have a 2.5 GPA on the last 60 hours of bachelor's course work, or a minimum cumulative 3.0 GPA on master's or doctoral work.

People who may benefit from the certificate program include community volunteer historians and preservationists, particularly members of historical societies and directors and docents at community museums; public officials, including historical commission members and urban planners. The program is also useful for educators, including administrators and teachers, who want to learn how to employ public history in their teaching and curriculum development.

We are dedicated to providing our students with a solid foundation for succeeding in this exciting realm where scholarship, public audiences and institutions intersect. I hope you will join us, and please feel free to contact me if I can be of any assistance or if you would like to meet on campus to discuss your questions or concerns.
