PAD gets a "PADDL"






PAD development liaison Shawn Soucie shakes hands with philosophy alumnus Alan Bates.

It was PAD member Alan Bates who came up with the notion of giving "seed money for seed money." His gift provides temporary funding for a student on a scholarship to help with development. The goal is to create a permanent endowment for assistance with development whether it be a student on a scholarship or a professional development officer. Bates' company, Southwest Plumbing, donated the money for the scholarship Shawn now holds. Professors Rui Zhu and Jeff Gordon accompanied a group of SWT students to China for three weeks this past May. Students learned about Asian culture, went sightseeing, and studied at the prestigious Peking University (also known as Bejing University), which Zhu refers to as the "Harvard of China."

The students had a choice of taking an introductory Philosophy course or an upper level seminar in Asian Philosophy. Zhu, who coordinated the trip, spent much of his time in lecture, as well as being a tour guide. Gordon spent his time studying Chinese culture and philosophy. Some of our own philosophy majors went on the trip including Clinton Hopper, Taj Watkins, Stacy Hetchler and Jennifer Runnels.

SWT was one of a dozen other universities including such luminaries as Harvard, Stanford, and Columbia to be involved with Peking's intercollegiate exchange program. The trip was a great adventure for all involved. Kudos to Rui Zhu for all of his efforts in making this a success.




