Commitment to Public Health Practices for SRO Lab Personnel

COVID-19 Self-Assessment

Before coming onto campus to conduct laboratory work or before any field work

If you have been given priority to resume laboratory or field work to you must **complete a self-assessment** of your health status and of your risk of being an asymptomatic carrier of the COVID-19 virus.

The *self-assessment for laboratory or field work should be continuous*, i.e. it should be conducted each day you intend to work.

If the answer to any of the following questions is **YES** then you should not come on to campus and must not resume laboratory research or fieldwork until the appropriate amount of time has passed. Your supervisor must be notified and your health provider contacted for further guidance. The Health Center is also available at 512.245.2161.

- Have you travelled from out of state in the last 14 days?
- Do you have a mild fever (100.4 or above), cough, difficulty breathing, or are otherwise feeling unwell e.g. headache?
- Does anyone in your shared living space or anyone with whom you have had recent contact, per CDC guidelines and university standards traveled from outside of the state or have a fever, cough, difficulty breathing, or otherwise feeling unwell?
- Has anyone in your shared living space or anyone with whom you have had recent contact been diagnosed with COVID-19?
- Have you attended events, private gatherings, or been in public spaces in the last 14 days where social distancing of 6 ft was not enforced?
