OUTSTANDING STUDENT/PEER EVALUATIONS FOR 42 YEARS: My teaching evaluations have consistently been among the highest in my department during my career. Peer reviews have also received the highest level of evaluation. I received teaching awards at each institution where I have taught. Students consistently tell me, in person and on my evaluations, how I change their lives for the better.

STUDENT SUCCESS: Many of my students have assumed high-profile careers in education, business, industry, and non-profit organizations. I keep in touch with former students, including many who are taking their place in academic ranks. One former student wrote, "Steve Beebe brought empowerment to my life . . . I don't know who I would be today if I wouldn't have met him."

PRESIDENT, NATIONAL COMMUNICATION ASSOCIATION: I served as President of the National Communication Association, the largest professional communication association in the world.

DEVELOPED SUCCESSFUL ACADEMIC PROGRAMS: I led efforts to establish several new programs at Texas State, including new minors in Political Communication, Leadership Studies, and Graduate Certificate Program in Corporate Communication and Training, for which I provide the lead instruction in the required seminar.

I LOVE TEACHING: As long as I can remember, I have wanted to be a teacher. I originally thought I would become a music teacher but soon switched to communication. I honestly have no idea what I would do if I were not an educator. Teaching is my life's work and passion.

TEACHING IS MY VOCATION: In 2002-2003 I was one of 34 people in the nation selected to receive the American Council on Education fellowship to explore a career as dean, provost, or president. After the fellowship, I realized that what I really wanted was to continue to teach—to work directly with students. Because I enjoy teaching, when serving as department chair for 28 years, I would frequently teach an uncompensated teaching overload during the summer.

STUDENT CENTERED: The multiple communication textbooks I have co-authored emphasize being audience-centered or other-oriented. I have the same emphasis when I teach: To be student-centered. Comments from students like this help me feel I am achieving my goal: "I love how passionate Beebe is. Everything he taught us was for our benefit. I never wanted to leave class or for the semester to end. I feel blessed to be in his class and to be taught by him."

MY TEACHING PHILOSOPHY:

IT IS BETTER TO GET A MESSAGE OUT OF SOMEONE THAT TO PUT ONE IN THEM:

My job as teacher is not to implant information in students' minds, but to help students connect new ideas with their knowledge and experiences.

STUDENTS SHOULD WORK HARDER THAN THE TEACHER:

As a corollary principle, students should always be actively involved in the learning process rather than passive receivers of information.

PASSION IS THE VELCRO OF LEARNING:

Great ideas presented without passion are like duct tape that has lost its stickiness.

TEACH FOR THE STUDENT'S "IN BASKET":

Everyone has an "in-basket"—either literal or metaphorical. I teach to make learning relevant to each student's needs and interests.

TEACHING IS LIKE DANCING--YOU HAVE TO FOCUS ON YOUR PARTNER:

I teach with the goal of developing a relationship with the learner--an ongoing connection with someone. To relate is to dance.

AUTHORED TEXTBOOKS USED BY MILLIONS:

My 12 co-authored textbooks (with editions totaling more than 75 volumes) are an extension of my teaching; they are the curricular standard for courses taught at 1200+ universities used throughout the world (including Russian- and Chinese-language editions) by an estimated five million students.

VISITING SCHOLAR AT OXFORD AND CAMBRIDGE UNIVERSITY:

Presented at both Oxford and Cambridge University; I teach a course at Oxford University based on a manuscript I discovered in Oxford's library written by C. S. Lewis, to have been co-authored by J. R. R. Tolkien.

HELPED ESTABLISH FIRST COMMUNICATION STUDIES PROGRAMS IN RUSSIA:

For 25 years with 15 trips to Russia, I helped establish the Russian Communication Association; founding member of the Association; co-director of the first Russian Communication Association Conference in Pyatigorsk, Russia.

PIONEERED THE NATION-WIDE DEVELOPMENT OF COMMUNICATION TRAINING CURRICULA:

I taught my first course in communication training more than 35 years ago. I helped establish the National Communication Association's Training and Development Division; I received its Lifetime Achievement Award in 2016. I am author of the leading textbook in communication training.

RURAL ROOTS: The road in front of the 100-year-old farmhouse in which I was raised was in Harry Truman's jurisdiction when he was in charge of road maintenance as presiding judge of Eastern Jackson County—twelve miles from where I was born in Independence, Missouri. As the middle child of 5 siblings, my chores (which included weeding the garden, feeding cows and pigs, chopping the ice for the cattle on frosty winter mornings) taught me discipline and a strong work ethic. My parents, who celebrated 76 years of marriage, were my first and best teachers.

EXCELLENT TEACHERS: I attended all 12 grades in the Grain Valley, Missouri, school district, where today I am honored to serve as a founding member of the district's Education Foundation. I am the only member of my family to obtain a college degree. I met my wife Sue at the University of Central Missouri while competing on the debate team. We were honored as Distinguished University Alumni of the University of Central Missouri in 2010. I completed my Ph.D. when I was 25 from the University of Missouri. After serving at the University of Miami, Florida, where I received tenure and early promotion, I joined the faculty of Southwest Texas State University in 1986.

TEACHING INFORMED BY SCHOLARSHIP: One way I express my teaching passion is as a author/researcher. I have authored or co-authored 12 widely-used books (with editions totaling 75 volumes), along with more than 50 articles and book chapters, and 150 professional papers.

INTERNATIONAL TEACHING: Educational highlights include serving as a Visiting Scholar at both Oxford University and Cambridge University. I have given lectures and conference presentations throughout Europe, Asia, and Central America, and have made 15 visits to Russia, to help establish the first communication studies programs there. While President of the National Communication Association I made international educational outreach a presidential focus.

PROFESSIONAL EDUCATOR/SPEAKER/CONSULTANT: I serve as a communication consultant, trainer, and conference speaker for several Fortune 500 corporations and government agencies, including presenting for the Governor of Texas Executive Development Program.

TEACHING HONORS: I have received multiple teaching awards at each university at which I have taught, including Honors Professor of the Year, the Everett Swinney Faculty Senate Teaching Award at Texas State, and Regents' Professor. Last year I received the Lifetime Achievement Award by the National Communication Association, Training and Development. The National Speaker's Association named me Outstanding Communication Professor in America.

MAKING A DIFFERENCE: What I value most is to make a difference in students' lives, as evidenced by this student: "There was not a single time I did not enjoy this class. I feel extremely honored to have been a part of this class. Dr. Beebe is not a professor in this class but a coach that guides each student to reach their full potential. I will never forget how much this class has helped me in my personal life. I LOVED THIS PROFESSOR."

As Dean of the College of Fine Arts and Communication, I am nominating Dr. Steven A. Beebe for the Minnie Stevens Piper Professor Award. Dr. Beebe has been a leader at Texas State for over thirty years, and I have had the pleasure of working alongside Dr. Beebe for the past eighteen years; as such my enthusiastic recommendation for Dr. Beebe being a recipient of this prestigious award is based on first-hand knowledge and experience. He is the epitome of what a university seeks in a teacher, scholar, and administrative leader. His impact on the Department of Communication Studies and his academic discipline has been immeasurable.

Dr. Beebe is a first-rate teacher who is genuinely respected by his students and peers, both here at Texas State and across the world. His areas of expertise include Interpersonal Communication, Small Group Communication, Public Speaking, Communication Training and Development, and the Fundamentals of Human Communication. Dr. Beebe excels at teaching these challenging topics to both undergraduate and graduate students. Students recognize both his vast knowledge and his genuine enthusiasm. As might be expected, Dr. Beebe is an excellent communicator, someone who can effectively explicate complex concepts in an accessible manner. He both challenges and inspires students to excel. He is committed to both undergraduate and graduate education, serving as a graduate research project director and/or Thesis/Dissertation Reader/Adviser on over three dozen projects; most recently he served as the Dissertation Director for a candidate at Oxford University, epitomizing the esteem and international reach of his expertise as a teacher.

Throughout his forty years of teaching in higher education, Dr. Beebe has been consistently recognized as being one of the best of the best. Just looking at his career at Texas State, a sampling of Dr. Beebe's accolades include being a Regents' Professor, a University Distinguished Professor, a Texas State Honors Professor of the Year, a Distinguished International Studies Professor, and multiple Teaching Excellence Awards from the Association of Speech Communication Students as well as a Texas State Distinguished Education Award. In 2017, Dr. Beebe received the Everette Swinney Faculty Senate Excellence in Teaching Award. Nationally, Dr. Beebe received the Outstanding Communication Professor in America Award from the National Speakers' Association and Texas State's COMM 1310 Fundamentals of Human Communication course that he helped develop has been recognized by the National Communication Association with a Program of Excellence Award, marking it as one of the top basic communication courses in the country.

Dr. Beebe created Texas State University's Study Abroad program at Oxford University, a course developed via Dr. Beebe's relationship with that distinguished University. On six separate occasions, he was awarded a position as a Visiting Scholar/Academic Visitor at Oxford, where he is now a permanent member of the Common Room of Wolfson College. While Dr. Beebe has

While Dr. Beebe is excellent in the classroom here at Texas State, he also directly impacts the classroom education of countless students both nationally and internationally. I say this because Dr. Beebe has authored or co-authored a remarkable twelve separate textbooks (over 70 editions) that have been translated into over a dozen languages. For Dr. Beebe publication and teaching are truly inseparable as he uses his expertise to help educate students across the world. While Dr. Beebe also does "scholarly research," his textbooks are truly aimed at facilitating effective teaching and learning. The scope, approach, and writing are all aimed at helping students learn the essential knowledge of the course, and so through his textbooks Dr. Beebe extends the influence of his teaching to a level that has improved the education of students across the nation and across the globe.

Having taught at Texas State University for eighteen years, and having served as Director of a graduate program, Chair of a department, and Dean of a college, I have had the opportunity to observe and interact with a large pool of faculty, and I am privileged to have worked with many excellent colleagues. Dear Minnie Stevens Piper Professor Selection Committee Members:

You're not going to believe this letter. You might deem it hyperbolic and overly enthusiastic. But please believe me: Every word is true, accurate, and descriptive of the person I recommend to you, for consideration as a recipient of the honor of being called a "Piper Professor." To wit: Professor Steven A. Beebe is the finest instructor I've had the pleasure of learning from and knowing for thirty-plus years. I am his colleague, his former employee (when he was my department chair in my first post-doctoral job), his textbook co-author, and more recently, his student, and so it is with this vast experience with and knowledge of Professor Beebe that I write this emphatic letter of recommendation. Professor Beebe embodies every quality that one hopes a master teacher would possess.

It was my good fortune to complete post-doctoral coursework under Dr. Beebe's tutelage in the summer of 2013 at Oxford University in England. Stepping out of my role as a university professor of communication, I enrolled as a post-doc student at Texas State University and participated in Dr. Beebe's courses on C. S. Lewis as a Master Communicator. Yes, I'm a longtime colleague and friend of Dr. Beebe's, but for the summer of 2013, I was a student learning from a master. It was a rewarding and stretching departure from being the one typically on the "other side of the desk" for over thirty years.

Please allow me to offer evidence of Dr. Beebe's instructional excellence on three fronts, corresponding to Aristotle's three elements of persuasion: *ethos*, *logos*, and *pathos*. First, as for *ethos* or credibility, multiple dimensions exist in this realm. I'd like to address the dimensions of ethics, competence (knowledge), trustworthiness, and dynamism. Dr. Beebe is a highly ethical person and his sense of fairness, justice, and ethics extends into the classroom—it's obvious. From the way he crafts his syllabi and course policies to how those expectations are communicated and carried out in the classroom to how he sensitively gives feedback on student performance, it's clear that Dr. Beebe is a person of the highest ethical standards. As regards the competence or knowledge element within *ethos*, Dr. Beebe has been a student of C. S. Lewis, particularly in terms of what Lewis can teach us about communication, for approximately two decades. His scholarly inquiry into Lewis and his persistent research at Oxford, as well as here in the U.S., have placed him among the preeminent Lewis scholars in the world, earning him a faculty position with Wolfson College at Oxford (no small achievement). Dr. Beebe's discovery of an unpublished partial manuscript of what was to be a book on language and communication co-authored by Lewis and J. R. R. Tolkien set the Lewis world afire a few years ago. Dr. Beebe brings curiosity and rigor to his classroom each and every day—his work ethic, persistence, and energy level are extraordinary.

Professor Beebe knows that trustworthiness doesn't reside in words, but must be earned through actions and consistency over time. Professor Beebe is trustworthiness walking. He consistently communicates respect for students, keeps their confidences, and conveys to them his appreciation for their endeavors and challenges. His depth of knowledge also makes you trust him when you're his student; you simply *know* that he speaks only the truth to you, that he knows of which he speaks (because he's put in the time and effort to become expert), and that he

“has your back.” A final dimension of *ethos* I wish to address is dynamism, sometimes referred to as charisma (which Dr. Beebe has in spades). His classes were always scintillating, as though he’d laid on the table a feast for your consumption and delight, as though each class was the best gift you’d ever received at Christmas. A more dynamic, charismatic classroom instructor you’ll never find.

Shifting to Aristotle’s dimension of *logos*, I view this in terms of preparation and having a logical, reasoned, well-thought-out approach to teaching. One thing I’ve learned from being a long-time college professor is that a classroom can easily descend into chaos, which inhibits student learning. Professors have to find that balance between creating a classroom atmosphere that encourages student engagement and having creativity devolve into chaos that leaves students wondering who’s in charge. Dr. Beebe walks that line perfectly—he’s the best I’ve ever seen. He is always prepared and communicates clearly his plan for a class session, his goals, and his means of accomplishing the goals. His diligent and reasoned approach, devoid of inflexibility or a controlling stance, strikes the perfect balance to maximize student reflection and learning.

And finally I address my favorite part of Aristotle’s triumvirate—*pathos*, or use of emotional appeals. Dr. Beebe knows how to make students *feel something* in a classroom, and I believe this is an overlooked and underemphasized dimension of teaching excellence. Dr. Beebe understands students’ fears; fear is evident when attempting to conquer something like a seminar on C. S. Lewis and communication, taught in a foreign country in a daunting, ancient setting such as Oxford University. He realizes that students have emotions; he recognizes his own emotional connection to the course material and the teaching/learning process. He understands the power of emotion—our unique human ability to feel, sense, and respond—and uses that understanding to profound effect in his classroom. He is emotionally fearless. His passion for his subject matter and sheer joy for teaching is obvious, infectious, and greatly appreciated.

In sum, Dr. Beebe is the consummate university instructor, as I have been privileged to witness and benefit from firsthand. I can think of no one more deserving of the superb description “Piper Professor.” He excels in all aspects of the teaching profession, which I have described in terms of *ethos*, *logos*, and *pathos*. I hope you believe me and believe this letter, because this is the truth about Professor Steven A. Beebe. I wish the selection committee members all the best in your deliberations.

**Recommendation of Dr. Steven A. Beebe
for a Minnie Stevens Piper Professorship**

I am honored to recommend Dr. Steven A. Beebe for a Piper Professorship. I have known Dr. Beebe since his arrival at Texas State three decades ago. Over the span of his career, he has been a distinguished teacher, a mentor to students and colleagues, a prolific researcher, a best-selling textbook author, and a campus leader. He has earned countless honors and was recently named Regents' Professor by the Texas State University System, a title conferred rarely and only in those few instances in which a faculty member "does it all"—excelling in every area of endeavor at a national level: teaching, research, and professional service.

While Dr. Beebe "does it all," his core vocation is, and always has been, teaching. In its sheer quantity and variety, his teaching record is remarkable, especially given his work as a successful department chair and his sustained engagement as a researcher and writer. He has taught 15 different courses at Texas State along with some two dozen others before arriving here—from introductory speech communication to graduate seminars in training and development. He has also been unusually generous in the time-consuming, labor-intensive work of directing graduate student projects—a kind of teaching that has an important ripple effect: many of the students he has mentored have gone on to careers themselves as successful teachers and professors.

If he has taught a great deal and in a variety of ways, Dr. Beebe is also widely known as a teacher who holds himself to a high standard of quality. He is meticulously well prepared and always looks for new ways to reach his students. Some of us have struggled over the years to adopt new teaching technologies—to give up lectures for more interactive and technologically savvy kinds of teaching. Dr. Beebe has never been in that category. While remaining true to the enduring principles of his discipline, he has sought out and welcomed new pedagogies. He has been nimble and even joyful in finding fresh ways to reach new generations of students, to engage and involve them even when doing so is a challenge. It is inspiring that after three decades of teaching, he remains eager to rethink and renew his work as a teacher

Another example of Dr. Beebe's continued growth is the summer course he has been offering in recent years at the University of Oxford—a study abroad experience in which students explore C. S. Lewis as a master communicator. The course is richly interdisciplinary, providing students with a cultural experience that could never be duplicated on our campus. Dr. Beebe not only teaches the course but also serves as guide and mentor for his students, many of whom are experiencing a new culture for the first time.

While a Piper Professorship is a *teaching* honor, I would be remiss in not pointing out Dr. Beebe's extraordinary achievements as a textbook author and scholar, which in my view are inseparable from his teaching. As co-author of many best-selling communication textbooks, he

has carried his passion for teaching from his own classrooms to classrooms across the United States and beyond, reaching an audience that extends to tens of thousands of students in hundreds of colleges and universities. Textbook writers play, as well, another critical role—they teach other teachers, especially new ones, how to teach, how to transmit to students the fundamental concepts of the discipline. There is no more striking testimony to the success of Dr. Beebe as a “teacher of teachers” than the fact that his colleagues across the nation have repeatedly adopted and re-adopted his books for their classes. His co-authored public speaking book, for example, is currently in its tenth edition, having consistently earned the loyalty of fellow teachers for more than 25 years—an extremely rare feat for any textbook.

Part of the success of Dr. Beebe’s textbooks is that they are grounded in solid, cutting-edge research. While developing new books and revising existing ones, he has remained fully engaged as a scholar, publishing nearly 70 refereed book chapters and journal articles in communication studies, often as first or sole author, in prestigious venues. Recently, his research on C. S. Lewis has taken him in a new direction, resulting in articles and a book that is nearing completion and prompting him to create his course on Lewis—yet another example of how his research invigorates his teaching.

Finally, at the risk of making Dr. Beebe sound impossibly well rounded, I will point out that, even with his strong commitment to teaching, to textbook writing, and to research and scholarship, he has also been an exemplar throughout his career of the “servant-leader.” Here on campus, he has been a highly respected, long-serving department chair. And beyond our campus, he has served with distinction at the highest levels of his profession—for example, as President of the National Communication Association. This position is not only a major honor, recognizing his stature as a top leader in his field, but also a testimony to the many years of work he has undertaken in advancing and advocating for the organization’s mission. It is no surprise, then, that Dr. Beebe has been honored widely for his service. On our campus, he was recognized with a Presidential Award for Excellence in Service, the university’s highest service honor.

Steven Beebe is a teacher by vocation—one who does his work out of love, not duty. Thousands of students have grown and flourished thanks to his challenging and caring mentorship and his countless other contributions to his discipline. I can think of no colleague at Texas State more deserving of a Piper Professorship. I recommend Dr. Steven A. Beebe for this honor with the greatest possible enthusiasm.

To The Piper Professor Award Selection Committee:

My name is Colter Ray and I am a doctoral candidate at Arizona State University. I am also a former student, longtime friend, and mentee of Dr. Steve Beebe. Those who know Steve know that he is a man who loves a good metaphor. Therefore, in expressing my support for Steve's nomination for this award, I too would like to employ a metaphor. That is, *if life is a journey, Steve Beebe is a landmark*. Those who have met and experienced Steve as a teacher and human being will clearly recall life before encountering Steve and life after meeting him. In the letter below, there are two points I would like to express. First, a class with Steve Beebe at the helm is unlike any other experience I have ever had, and second, when Steve is your professor, expect to gain a mentor for the rest of your life, not just a semester.

To my first point, I never thought I would have such an enjoyable time trying to keep up with a man in his sixties speed walking through Oxford, England like a child at Disneyland; however, this was my experience studying abroad with Steve Beebe. While in Oxford, I enrolled in Steve's course on C.S. Lewis and communication. The course took place throughout the city of Oxford at the landmarks where Lewis lived his life. As our teacher, Steve expertly orchestrated each class as a walking tour into the life of Lewis and accompanied these adventures with insider's knowledge and access to primary sources such as Lewis's own journals, correspondences, and handwritten manuscripts. These journeys reflected a passionate teacher eagerly sharing the connections he discovered between Lewis's writings and communication research.

Furthermore, class with Steve is an environment conducive to growth—both as a student and as a citizen of the world. From a pedagogical standpoint, he is an expert at providing constructive feedback in a way that emphasizes one's strengths while discussing areas for improvement. I still remember his comment on my term paper that, admittedly, was disorganized in its thoughts. His response: "This paper is like a building. It has the bricks needed to be something great, but it needs more mortar to bring the ideas together." Not only did this critique help me as a writer during that class, but it has shaped how I structure the manuscripts I submit to academic journals.

To my second point, since encountering the landmark that is Steve Beebe, my life has only changed for the better. He has guided me through the difficult decision to leave the corporate world and pursue my dreams to become a professor and he has guided me through difficult personal decision as well. Like any great landmark, you find yourself returning periodically and often leave with a greater sense of perspective on life. Steve is my landmark to whom I return when I need perspective. I am thankful to have him in my life as a landmark to which I can turn. Steve Beebe is truly the greatest teacher and one of the greatest human beings I have ever known and I wholeheartedly endorse him for this prestigious award.
