Fall Application Due Dates



<u>Faculty Development Leave</u>: by September 15, notify department chair or school director of intent to apply, applications are due October 1. Apply via the <u>Faculty Requests</u> application system.

<u>Nontenure Line Faculty Workload Release</u>: by September 15, notify department chair or school director of intent to apply, applications are due October 8 via the <u>Faculty Requests</u> application system.

<u>Piper Professor</u>: applications are due via the <u>Faculty Requests</u> application system September 21 (please note that previous communications had an earlier date).

REP: applications are due October 17. Apply via the <u>Texas State Internal Proposal Online Submission</u> page.



Dr. Araceli Ortiz, Research Associate Professor in the LBJ Institute for STEM Education and Research, is this year's Faculty Senate Fellow. As Senate Fellow, Dr. Ortiz's project will focus on building community among faculty women of color on our campus. She will explore ways to support faculty women of color and to increase retention and achievement of tenure in this group.

University Lecturers Series



The School of Social Work and University Lecturers Series will host Gregory Boyle on September 18th, 7 p.m. at Evans Auditorium. This event is part of the Common Experience at Texas State theme, *Innovation*.

A Jesuit priest, from 1986 to 1992 Father Boyle served as pastor of Dolores Mission Church, then the poorest Catholic parish in Los Angeles that also had the highest concentration of gang activity in the city. Father Boyle witnessed the devastating impact of gang violence on his community during the so-called "decade of death" that began in Los Angeles in the late 1980s and peaked at 1,000 gang-related killings in 1992. In the face of law enforcement tactics and criminal justice policies of suppression and mass incarceration as the means to end gang violence, Father Boyle and parish and community members adopted what was a radical approach at the time: treat gang members as human beings. In 1988 they started what would eventually become Homeboy Industries, which employs and trains former gang members in a range of social enterprises, as well as provides critical services to thousands of men and women who walk through its doors every year seeking a better life.
