- Faculty Senate elections are on the horizon. In this election cycle, there are eight senate seats open in all colleges except Applied Arts. Voting will be conducted March 21 - April 1, with runoff voting April 11 - 18.
- The Restricted Research Expenditures Report indicates Texas State is more than a year ahead of the projected schedule to achieve the expenditures benchmark required for National Research University (NRU) status.
- The university's <u>Carnegie classification</u> has been advanced by two categories to Doctoral University: Higher Research Activity. Advancing to the highest tier in the next reclassification cycle will depend largely on significantly increasing our output of doctoral graduates.
- The Board of Regents has approved the university's recommendations for 2016-17 Faculty Development Leave (FDL). The list of <u>faculty awarded leave</u> is posted on the Faculty Senate webpage as is the list of faculty who will receive the Supplemental Award to support their FDL activities.
