Faculty Senate Bulletin April 2016



- Please remember to vote in the Faculty Senate elections. The election
 <u>portal</u> for the first round of voting will be active until April 4. During this
 round, two candidates will be identified for each open seat and the run-off
 election will be held April 11-18. In this election cycle, there are senate
 seats open in all colleges except Applied Arts.
- The perceptions of deans, provost and president <u>surveys</u> will close on Friday, April 8. Please take this opportunity to provide your input.
- The Senate's Environment and Sustainability Committee seeks proposals
 for an Earth Day (April 22) <u>competition</u>, open to individuals, departments,
 offices, teams, and student groups. Please send queries and requests for
 application information to <u>Senator Rebecca Bell-Metereau</u>, co-chair of the
 committee.
- Governor Abbott has formed a <u>task force</u> on college affordability and workforce development. The group comprises heads of the Texas Education Agency, Texas Higher Education Coordinating Board, and Texas Workforce Commission. They will embark on a six-month, six city "listening tour" that will visit San Antonio on April 26.
- Nationwide among all faculty, those in tenure-track positions received the highest overall median salary increase (2.2%), according to data from CUPA-HR's <u>2015-16 Faculty in Higher Education Salary Survey</u>. The overall median salary increase for faculty was 2.0% for both public and private institutions.
- Faculty whose physicians have ordered 3-D mammograms should be aware that United Healthcare is not currently covering this procedure.
 Health Select subscribers will have to pay for this procedure out-of-pocket. It might be possible to <u>appeal</u> nonpayment decisions through the ERS office.
