Faculty Senate Bulletin October 2016

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The Faculty Senate has announced a referendum regarding the proposed amendment to the Faculty Constitution. This <u>amendment</u> would permit the senate to reflect the faculty as one body. The senate will hold the last open forum for comment and to address questions about the proposed change on **Monday, November 7, 3:00 - 4:00 pm**, on the 11th floor of JCK.

- Hornsby/Burleson areas (203) 50-20 spaces (red permits may use green and purple areas)

Parking locations not on this list are usually full by 9:00 am.

The Faculty Senate has drafted revisions to the university **faculty office hours** policy that reframes the longstanding practice of faculty being reliably available for out of class instruction and advising of students as **faculty contact hours outside of class**. The revision states that in addition to in-person meetings, a variety of means may be used to meet with students, including via telephone, electronic communication, or other means that allow faculty to effectively support students outside of scheduled class periods. The revision will require departments and schools to establish written policies for faculty contact hours outside of class.

The draft has been presented to the Council of Academic Deans and the Council of Chairs and will be incorporated into PPS 4.01, Conduct and Planning of Courses, and distributed by the Office of the Provost for comment.
