Faculty Senate Minutes Wednesday, May 1, 2013

• Legislative Update

The President reported that deliberations are not over, but at this point, Tuition Revenue Bonds are still in play and there is ongoing discussion of ways to provide some relief for the drain on university income caused by the Hazelton legislation. One proposal is for one-time appropriation of \$30 million. Texas State has one of the highest enrollments of Hazelton eligible students in the state. It also seems probable that there will be TRIP funding in the budget to alleviate the backlog of requests.

• Promotion and Tenure Cycle Summary

President Trauth commented on the high quality of the candidates who applied for promotion and tenure and the Provost reported that 21 of 24 candidates for full professor were approved for promotion, 34 of 35 candidates for tenure were approved and 34 of 38 candidates for promotion to associate professor were approved.

• Planning for Future Commencement Ceremonies

Dr. Bourgeois explained that there are potentially more people planning to attend two of commencement ceremonies than can be accommodated in the Strahan Coliseum stands, so there will be overflow seating provided in an ancillary gym with streamed video of the ceremony. The administration does not want to limit the number of guests. Planning for high attendance at commencement ceremonies is ongoing, with the number of ceremonies to remain at six in Fall 2013, but seven for Spring 2014. As a possible long term solution, the university will take a hard look at adding seats to Strahan to better serve both graduation ceremonies and basketball games.

• Counseling Center Follow-Up, Director Search

The President confirmed that there would be a Faculty Senate representative on the search committee for the Counseling Center Director position. Dr. Van Wyatt will chair the search committee, which will report its recommendations to VPSA Joanne Smith.

• Athletic Conference Update

There was a discussion of the move from WAC to the Sun Belt Conference that will occur on July 1. 2013. The plan is to stay in this conference for the foreseeable future.

University Name Change

The President reported that the legislature approved dropping San Marcos from the university's name. This will help eliminate confusion for the Round Rock campus. The change will officially go into effect September 1, 2013. Departments are encouraged to refrain from ordering letterhead until after that date.
