Mathematics Department presents Professor Mohamed Omar, Friday October 21 at 3:30 PM - Derrick

Mohamed Omar, PhD, Harvey Mudd College Associate Professor of Mathematics and Joseph B. Platt Chair in Effective Teaching, specializes in algebraic methods in graph theory and combinatorial optimization. Omar earned his bachelor's and master's degrees in pure mathematics, combinatorics and optimization from the University of Waterloo in 2006 and 2007, respectively, and his PhD in mathematics from the University of California, Davis, in 2011.

Omar is interested in and heavily involved with mathematics outreach, in two main capacities: increasing diversity in STEM, and mathematical enrichment for high school students. He is active in

Professor Omar will speak about his experience using creativity and overcoming obstacles as a working mathematician.




The Department of Agricultural Science presents Dr. Frank Asche, Thursday, October 27th.

Frank Asche is a natural resource economist with a primary research focus on seafood, but who also engages in other natural resource challenges such as energy and food production in general. Frank is

president of the International Association of Aquaculture Economics and Management (IAAEM), editor for Aquaculture Economics and Management and associate editor for Marine Resource Economics. He was also a member of the team that developed the Fish Price Index of the United Nation's Food and Agricultural Organization (FAO).
