


Executive Summary

Purpose

This research continues the Gilbert M. Grosvenor Center for Geographic Education's investigation into State Middle School and High School Geography Standards and Course Requirements. Conducted by a graduate seminar class at Texas State University during the fall of 2013, the purpose of this research was to examine the status of geography within social studies standards and course requirements in the United States and the District of Columbia, examining each state separately. The data used to create the maps and tables can be found on the information pages about each state in the last section of the report.

While many states include the teaching and learning of geographic concepts, knowledge, and skills within their K-12 curriculum, the focus of this survey is the presence of geography standards and course requirements from sixth grade to twelfth grade. The research did not aim to identify geography taught at the kindergarten to fifth grade levels because social studies courses at these grade levels generally encompass a mixture of social studies subject matter areas. We must also note that the U.S. K-12 education system is in constant flux and different priorities often impact state standards and graduation requirements, especially for social studies, and for geography, in particular.

The original intent of this collection of social studies standards/strands information was to provide data for longitudinal analysis of trends in social studies/geography emphasis on a state by state basis. This has proven to be very difficult, as states have changed their definitions, course titles, and graduation requirements. We hope that this document proves useful, but we caution researchers to look deeper, when and if changes are apparent, from year to year. You may simply be looking at a varying definition rather than a more substantive matter, such as a change in teaching and learning requirements.

Geography Course Requirements

The rubric that guided the survey for this research recognized that states exercise three options for administering geography courses in middle school and high school:

- The state requires a stand-alone geography course*
- The state does not require a geography course
- The state allows local school districts to decide what courses are taught If geography was a choice in a list of courses to fulfill a high school graduation requirement, it was not considered a required course.

*Many states require a geography course that is combined with another social studies subject, such as "World History/U.S. History and Geography," "World Geography and Citizenship," or combined with the state history course, such as New Mexico's "New Mexico History and Geography" course.

Standards and Strands

For the purpose of this report, a "standard" is defined as a set of content knowledge and skills that is designed for a class that mainly focuses on geography. A "strand" is defined as geography content knowledge merged with other social studies content for a class that is not exclusively geographic, but the nature of which can be strengthened by a geographic

perspective or skill. Most states have organized their social studies curricula around four or five social studies subjects including history, geography, civics, government, and economics. Using these definitions, it was determined that there are three categories for classification regarding how geography course curricula are organized:

- Standard separate set of geography standards
- Strand geography is included as part of the social studies standards
- Both as a separate set of geography standards and geography is included as part of the social studies standards

Results

At the middle school level, 17 states require a stand-alone geography course; five of those states are a combined geography course. Eleven states do not require a geography course and offer a general social studies course instead, and 23 states allow local school districts to decide what courses are offered. At the high school level only ten states require a stand-alone geography course for students to graduate from high school; seven of those are a combined course. Twenty-five states do not require a geography course and 16 states allow graduation and course requirements to be set at the district level, which may or may not include a stand-alone geography course (see "Geography Course Requirements"). At both levels, the combination course is counted as a geography requirement at that level (See "States with a combined social studies subject and geography course" table).

At the middle school level, there are 41 states that have geography as a strand within the state social studies standards, five that have separate geography standards, and the remainder have both geography strands within the social studies curriculum and separate standards for geography. At the high school level, 30 states have geography as a strand within the state social studies standards, 12 have a separate set of standards for geography, and nine have both geography strands within the social studies standards and a separate set of geography standards (see "Geography's Place within Social Studies Standards").

This study also aimed to determine state standards revision schedules. It was found that almost half of the states (23) have no scheduled revision cycle planned for the social studies standards. Two states completed the standards revision and adoption process in 2013 and 12 states are set to begin the process in 2014. Six states have planned standards revision schedules during 2015- 2016, and five states during 2017. Oregon is set for 2018, Minnesota in 2019, and Kansas in 2020.

Conclusions

As previously mentioned, data collection for longitudinal analysis can be difficult at times with constant change in definitions and personnel handling the data. The results presented here, however, are consistent with the past three reports completed over the past six years and show that on average about 15 states have a required stand-alone geography course at the middle school level, and on average about nine states have a required stand-alone geography course at the high school level. Also consistent with past reports is that geography standards are now in some way or another represented in all individual state social studies standards.







Middle School Social Studies Requirements

North Dakota state law sets broad course requirements for all schools, including middle school level instruction. NDCC 15.1-21 outlines these requirements. In order to be an approved middle school, schools must provide instruction in social studies, including the United States Constitution, United States history, geography, government, and North Dakota studies, with an emphasis on the geography, history, and agriculture of this state, in the fourth and eighth grades.

High School Social Studies Graduation Requirements

North Dakota state law sets broad course requirements for all schools, including high school level instruction.

NDCC 15.1-21 outlines these requirements. In order to be an approved high school, schools must provide four units of instruction in social studies, including one unit of world history, one unit of United States history, and either one unit of problems of democracy or one-half unit of United States government and one-half unit of economics.
