Powerful Geography (PG)

We are busy developing a 5-7-year research project that will result in new national and state standards, assessments, and learning materials. This project will be a "bottom-up" curriculum framework effort, what Wesley Null would call a "liberating curriculum". It will rely on recent work in GeoCapabilities and statelevel realities that will allow each individual student the opportunity to use geography content and skills to achieve personal goals, ambitions, and career paths. PG will recognize that geography is part of the social studies curriculum at the state and local level.


