

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RESEARCHER/AUTHOR'S NOTES

This survey clearly demonstrates the variability of social studies education across the nation. Not only do social studies requirements and curriculum vary across each state, but each state's definition differs. Some states use standards as mandatory course requirements for classroom curriculum, whereas other states view standards as general guidelines, leaving all decisions up to local education agencies.

It is important to note that there has been a recent rise of mandatory instruction in ethnic studies, Holocaust education, and new requirements for students to pass a civics test before they graduate high school. These have been noted on the individual state sheets when applicable, but please note that there may be some missing and this survey does not complete the entire social studies picture as the purpose was to just focus on geography.

Overall, the consensus is that geography is represented in the social studies, however it continues to play a secondary role to history, many times being combined with world history or U.S. history. Some would argue that geography is required in every state at every grade level because of the interdisciplinary nature of social studies and the pivotal role geography plays to buttress history, economics, and civics education. But as geography educators we should strive to include geographic skills, perspectives, and content in a geography specific course in middle and high school for students to truly understand and appreciate all that geography has to offer.

This report reflects the 2020-2021 school year and may not include recent changes that have since taken place.

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EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

PURPOSE

This report is the sixth survey conducted by the Gilbert M. Grosvenor Center for Geographic Education. It is an investigation of middle school and high school geography standards and requirements by state during the 2020-2021 school year. This study was first conducted in 2009 and has been completed every two to three years. The purpose of this research is to examine the status of geography by looking at social studies standards and course requirements in each of the fifty states and the District of Columbia.

While many states teach geographic concepts, knowledge, and skills within the K-12 curriculum, the focus of this survey is solely on grades 6- 12. Every state embeds geography within the social studies standards and curriculum from kindergarten through grade 5, therefore these grades are not discussed in detail. However, at the upper grades, a variation of social studies courses are offered, usually divided into world history, U.S. history, state history, geography, government/civics, and economics.

This long-term data collection has allowed for longitudinal analysis of trends in social studies and geography on a state-by-state basis. This document functions as a tool to analyze these trends, but researchers must be cautious to look deeper, when and if changes are apparent from year to year. Some changes are a fundamental change (e.g., change in high school graduation requirements through state law), while other changes may be due to varying definitions used by the researchers or state school officials (e.g., required stand-alone geography course versus a required combined course). A brief analysis of the last six surveys is provided in the section, "Exploring the Last Ten Years".

Data were collected by accessing state's education websites. As expected, each state is different in terms of stating educational mandates, a byproduct of education being state-based and locally controlled. To make this survey as practical as possible, these state differences are highlighted on their individual state information sheets, while some consistency of definitions is maintained to effectively categorize states based on their geography course requirements and recommendations for the results.

GEOGRAPHY COURSE REQUIREMENTS

The survey identifies state's social studies course requirements and recommendations for middle and high schools.

High School

In year's past, the high school requirements were determined by looking at the number of social studies credits needed to fulfill the state-mandated high school graduation requirement. In some states these courses are explicitly identified, while in other states it simply states the number of credits needed leaving it up to local education agencies (LEAs) to determine the specific courses.

For the purpose of the 2020-2021 survey, high school graduation requirements are identified with the state-mandated minimum number of social studies credits needed. This is with the underlying knowledge that there is local control, and this number may not represent every single high school within the state. Also, to clarify, it does not factor in states who have credits allocated under "Electives" which a geography course can satisfy. This survey strictly reports on the "Social Studies" credits needed for graduation.

When the graduation requirements are explicit, they are outlined under the high school graduation requirements section on the individual state information sheet (e.g., Alabama). When

the courses are not explicitly stated, state standards are consulted to provide some content and course possibilities that may be available to fulfill the social studies requirements (e.g., Connecticut). In these circumstances, it is noted that this follows a "sample sequence of courses based upon the state curriculum framework and/or social studies standards". And then, there are states that are complete local control (e.g., Wisconsin) that provide no explicit statemandated high school graduation requirements or standards that identify content or course sequence. For the 2020-2021 survey it is also important to note that Global Studies and World Studies courses are defined as a combination course since the course includes history, geography, civics, and economic standards.

Based upon the above explanation and previous surveys, high school geography requirements are categorized as the following:

- 1. Geography is a **REQUIRED** standalone course for high school graduation.
- 2. Geography is **COMBINED** with another social studies course and is <u>REQUIRED</u> for high school graduation.
- 3. Geography is given as an **OPTION** in which students choose between a geography course or another social studies course to <u>fulfill a requirement</u>.
- 4. Geography can be chosen as an **ELECTIVE** to <u>fulfill a requirement</u>.
- 5. Geography is **NOT REQUIRED** to fulfill the social studies requirement.
- 6. Social studies courses are **LOCAL CONTROL** and the local education agencies set the course requirements.

Middle School

When analyzing middle school, grades 6-8, the course requirements are even more ambiguous than high school. Therefore, this section on the state information sheet is no longer titled "Middle School Requirements", but "Middle School Recommendations" instead, since very few states have a mandated middle school curriculum.

State's social studies standards and curriculum frameworks are used to help determine the sequence and recommendation of middle school courses. Standards define what students are expected to learn in a particular subject and/or grade, and curriculum defines how teachers will teach to ensure students learn the standards. Taking this difference into consideration, the survey uses both documents to help maintain some consistency when categorizing geography course recommendations.

There are some states that provide a separate curriculum framework guide that lists the courses at each grade level and aligns to the state standards (e.g., California), or states that include a scope and sequence of content for grade levels within the standards document (e.g., Arizona). Ultimately, the majority of states leave course decisions to local education agencies to make the final decision. Therefore, in the 2020-2021 survey, the classification of geography courses in middle school relies heavily on context clues from both the social studies standards and curriculum frameworks with the understanding that majority of the states ultimately have local control and determine the curriculum and courses.

Each state information sheet sheds light on how the courses are classified. When the middle school courses reflect a requirement the course titles are included (e.g., Alabama). Many states require a course that combines geography with another subject such as history or civics. These

courses are identified as a combined course (e.g., California). When a state provides a sample sequence of courses within the curriculum framework or standards document (e.g., Arkansas, Connecticut) the course title is included with a note that it represents a "sample sequence of courses based upon the state social studies standards/curriculum framework". Therefore, if a geography course is included in the sample sequence, it is not considered required due to the local control aspect, so instead it is categorized as optional. This is to differentiate between states that are purely local control and those that have provided possible course options that include geography. A combined course can be either required or optional. This difference is noted in the state individual pages. When there is no discernable course title but the core content focus of the standards for a specific grade is geography, it is noted as a social studies course with a primary focus on geography (e.g., Florida). And just like high school, there are some states that are strictly local control that provide no guidance in their social studies standards or curriculum frameworks.

Based upon the above explanations, middle school geography recommendations are categorized as the following:

- 1. Geography is a **REQUIRED** standalone course.
- 2. Geography is **COMBINED** with another social studies course, can be required or optional.
- 3. Geography is **OPTIONAL** because local education agencies ultimately decide how/when the standards are taught, but the suggested sequence of courses/standards recommends geography content/course.
- 4. Geography content is the **PRIMARY FOCUS** of the course/standards, but the course is identified as Social Studies.
- 5. Geography is **NOT REQUIRED** as a standalone course.
- 6. Social studies courses are **LOCAL CONTROL** and the local education agencies set the course requirements.

STANDARDS AND STRANDS

Geography is one of the four core academic subjects in the social studies --- along with U.S. and world history, government/civics, and economics/personal financial literacy. Since the inception of national standards in the early 1990s, states have adopted their own set of social studies standards that dictate what students should know and be able to do at each grade level or grade span relevant to their specific state. Previous surveys examined each state's social studies standards document to determine the degree to which geographic concepts, knowledge, and skills are taught in each grade level. That meant if geography had a separate set of standards for a stand-alone geography course, or if the geography standards were embedded within the social studies standards as a strand.

This 2020-2021 survey, however, discontinues to categorize state standards because of the immense variation among states in how standards are written and conveyed. Some states write standards for a specific course, some write them by grade level, while others by grade span. The purpose of this survey is not to evaluate the geography standards as the Fordham Foundation¹

does, but instead to provide a link to the document so that the reader can explore the standards on their own. A follow-up survey will explore the standards in more detail on a state-by-state basis. This survey will not evaluate standards, but instead provide a singular document to show how social studies standards are organized and specifically how geography is represented within those standards for each state.

STANDARDS ADOPTION/REVISION SCHEDULE

As education reforms change (i.e., common core, STEM-centered, bottom-up, focus on diversity and inclusion) and new academic content is updated, state standards should change as well to ensure students are learning the most up-to-date content knowledge and skills and addressing the present times. Geography released national standards in 1994 and a revised edition in 2012. The National Council for the Social Studies released social studies standards in 1994 and 2010, and then the *College, Career and Civic Life (C3) Framework for Social Studies Standards* were released to provide more rigorous standards in history, geography, civics, and economics in 2013. A variety of these documents have been used by states to help develop the social studies and geography standards.

A component of this survey is to identify the year in which the current state social studies standards were adopted and the next time a revision is scheduled. It is also noted when they are revised, modified, and implemented, if available. The entire process from revision to adoption usually takes two years. It then takes an additional year for the standards to be fully implemented throughout the state. In some cases, states do not update their content standards, but instead update a curriculum framework for teachers to use as a guide.

STUDENT ENROLLMENT DATA

This year the survey includes student enrollment data when possible. Majority of states report on statewide enrollment data for each grade level. This report includes statewide student enrollment data for grades 6-8 only, which is included in the individual state information sheets. These three grade levels are reported on because course offerings at those grade levels tend to be more universal across the state, as compared to high school course offerings and the possibility of electives. Therefore, if a state requires geography to be taught in grade 7 (like Alabama), the report shows a sensible number of how many students took that geography course. Some states provide specific course enrollment numbers and those are included when available for geography courses. Every state information sheet includes the College Board's Advanced Placement (AP) © Human Geography data. These data come from the 2019-2020 school year and reflect those students who took the exam, not necessarily all students who were enrolled in the course. Therefore, this leads to some discrepancies in states where enrollment numbers are reported by the state versus the College Board numbers (e.g., Connecticut and Texas).

RESULTS

GEOGRAPHY COURSE REQUIREMENTS AND RECOMMENDATIONS

The 2020-2021 survey solidifies that each state varies greatly when it comes to requiring and offering geography. The survey includes individual state information sheets to explain in more detail the course requirements and recommendations. Table 1 displays the total number of states within each of the prescribed categories in which geography courses can fulfill course requirements and recommendations, adhering to the criteria and definitions applied by previous surveys and the researcher to maintain consistency. Table 2 shows how each state is categorized. Refer to the individual state information sheets to learn more about why a state is identified as it is.

High School

There are only three states (Minnesota, New Hampshire, and Utah) that require a standalone geography course for high school graduation. Ten states require a combined geography and another social studies subject course for graduation. This includes World Studies and Contemporary Studies courses. Four states give students a choice between geography or another course to fulfill a social studies credit for high school graduation. There are 18 states that have elective credits that geography can fulfill. Fourteen states do not require any type of geography course for high school graduation. While eight states are complete local control and leave all high school graduation course requirements up to the local education agencies and school districts. Totals go over 51 because some states fulfill multiple categories (e.g., New Hampshire requires a standalone geography course and has an elective credit).

Middle School

There are four states that have a required standalone geography course in middle school. Twenty states offer a combined course in middle school, eleven of which are a required course, while nine are optional leaving the course offerings decisions to the local education agencies. There are nine states that identify a standalone geography course as optional, based upon a sample sequence of courses provided by the state social studies standards and or curriculum framework. There are two states that have social studies courses taught at middle school, and the primary focus of the standards at one of those grades is geography content. There are eight states that do not require any type of geography course in middle school, while twelve states are pure local control. Again, totals are over 51 due to some states fulfilling multiple categories.

SOCIAL STUDIES STANDARDS ADOPTION/REVISION SCHEDULE

Table 3 showcases the years that the social studies standards were adopted and if there was a revision completed later that year is used instead. There are 33 states that have revised their social studies standards within the last five years (years 2017-2021), fifteen from 2012-2016, four from 2007 to 2011, one from 2002-2006, and only one is over ten years.

Table 4 provides state-by-state detail of when states last revised or adopted the standards and the upcoming revision/adoption year. Looking at upcoming revisions and adoptions, there are nine states that have revised or adopted their social studies standards in 2020 or are currently in the process. Twelve states will start the revision process in the next four years (2022-2025). Two states are set to revise their standards in 2026 and three states during the years 2028 – 2030. The remaining 26 states have no expected revision or adoption date scheduled for the social studies standards.

EXPLORING THE LAST TEN YEARS

This survey is the sixth survey in a collection that explores the status of geography within the middle and high schools. So how has geography changed since the survey first started in 2009-2010 compared to 2020-2021?

GEOGRAPHY COURSE REQUIREMENTS AND RECOMMENDATIONS

To compare the surveys, it is important to address that the rubric for categorizing the geography course requirements has changed over the years. Below is a description of each rubric that was followed during the first five surveys. There has been some consistency in these categorizations, such as geography is required, geography is not required, and local control. Identifying geography courses as a combined course has also been an established classification of geography courses.

The classification of "optional", however, has altered over the years. Optional consistently meant if students had a choice between World History and World Geography to fulfill a requirement (i.e., 2015-2016 survey). However, at times optional also included electives that did not specifically state geography (i.e., 2009-2010, 2011-2012, 2017-2018). And even further in the 2013-2014 survey, there is no optional or elective classification, and these states were classified as not requiring geography. In the 2020-2021 survey, there is now a distinction between "optional" and "electives". The 2020-2021 version of optional also considers local control decisions (primarily at the middle school grades), therefore states that may have been classified as local control are now classified as optional.

In the 2017-2018 survey, geography was considered required if the primary focus of the course/standards was in geography content. In the 2020-2021 survey, this was turned into a new category "primary focus" to differentiate between states that had a clear geography course and those that did not. In the first five surveys, each state was only classified under one category, which has changed in the 2020-2021 survey to account for the various ways states require geography courses.

It is important to review these rubrics and keep them in mind when examining Tables 5-8. For more in-depth information, each survey is available on the <u>Gilbert M. Grosvenor Center for Geographic Education's website</u> under "Publications" and "<u>State of the State Standards</u>."

2009-2010 SURVEY

- 1. Yes, geography is a required course.
- 2. Yes, **optional**. There is a choice between World History and Geography, or Geography can be chosen as an elective.
- 3. Yes, state required geography **combined** as part of a social studies course.
- 4. No, geography is not required.
- 5. Local control.

2011-2012 SURVEY

- 1. Yes, geography is a **required** course.
- 2. Yes, **combined**. Geography is part of a History and Geography course.
- 3. Yes, **optional**. Geography may be chosen by either a school district or student to fulfill a state social studies requirement.
- 4. No, geography is **not required**.
- 5. Local control, individual districts may require geography.

2013-2014 SURVEY

- 1. Yes, the state **requires** a stand-alone geography course.
- 2. No, the state does **not require** a geography course.
- 3. The state allows **local school districts** to decide what course are taught.
- 4. Geography is a **combined course** with other subjects.
- 5. If geography was a **choice** in a list of courses to fulfill it was **not considered required**.

2015-2016 SURVEY

- 1. Yes, a **stand-alone** geography course is required.
- 2. Yes, a geography/other social studies **combined** course is required.
- 3. No, a geography course is **not required.**
- 4. **Optional** World History or World Geography required.
- 5. Local school districts set all course requirements.

2017-2018 SURVEY

- 1. Yes, a **geography** course is required (or geography content is the primary focus of the course/standards).
- 2. Yes, a geography/other social studies **combined** course is required.
- 3. No, a geography course is **not required.**
- 4. **Optional**, students choose between a geography course or another social studies course to fulfill a requirement (or elective).
- 5. Local school districts control and set course requirements.

2020-2021 SURVEY

- 1. Geography is a **required** standalone course for high school graduation.
- 2. Geography is **combined** with another social studies course and is <u>REQUIRED</u> for high school graduation.
- Geography is given as an option- students choose between a geography course or another social studies course (high school) OR Geography is OPTIONAL because local education agencies ultimately decide how/when the standards are taught (middle school).
- 4. Geography content is the **primary focus** of the course/standards (middle school).
- 5. Geography can be chosen as an **elective** to <u>fulfill a requirement</u>.
- 6. Geography is **not required** to fulfill the social studies requirement.
- 7. Social studies courses are **local control** and the local education agencies set the course requirements.

High School

There has been a steady number of states that require geography for high school graduation over the last decade. Starting with six in 2009 (Minnesota, Mississippi, New Hampshire, South Dakota, Texas, and Utah), there was a decline to three in 2013 (Mississippi, South Dakota, Utah), an uptick back to six in 2017 (Minnesota, Mississippi, Oregon, South Dakota, Utah, West Virginia), but in 2020 it is back to three states (Minnesota, New Hampshire, and Utah) that require a standalone geography course for high school graduation. The differences among these requirements over the decade can in part be due to law changes, e.g., Texas passed House Bill 5 in 2013 that no longer required geography for high school graduation. However, a deeper look at the surveys shows that in 2011 and 2013 Minnesota was classified as optional and local control, respectively, even though the state has consistently required 0.5 credits in geography.

This is one example of why when change is present it is important to refer to the surveys to see how the researchers' classified states. Many states are local control and that has caused various discrepancies over the years to categorize course requirements and recommendations.

SOCIAL STUDIES STANDARDS ADOPTION/REVISIONS SCHEDULE

Some states try to revise their standards every five to eight years, while other states have no set plans for standard revision cycles. Or in the case like California, the standards stay the same and the curriculum framework is updated every eight years. In some cases, social studies standards revisions are pushed aside due to funding and budget restrictions. However, in this past survey, it was noticed that more than half of the states have updated their social studies standards within the last five years. There is no telling if this is purely coincidence that states have their revision cycle line up every so often, or if this was more of a purposeful revision plan to address many of the new events happening in the world that deal heavily with social studies subject areas. Such as a move for more ethnic studies (e.g., American Indian Tribal Groups/Indigenous People studies, African studies, Hispanic studies), an improved Holocaust education, and a momentum for a stronger civics' education led by the Educating for American Democracy project, propelled by current civic and political movements.

Each survey collects when the standards are adopted and revised and when their next revision is planned. Table 9 looks at that data from 2017-2018 and compares it to states social studies standards as reported in the 2020-2021 survey. States could have revised or adopted their social studies standards "early", for example, in 2017 Alabama's social studies standards were adopted in 2010 and the state had plans to revise the standards in 2020. Alabama in fact revised them in 2015. Some states completed their revisions/adoptions right "on time" like Arizona. Other states who did not have a planned revision/adoption year ended up either having "no change", or if new standards were released the "number of years" between is noted in the last column.
