TEACHING CERTIFICATION REQUIREMENTS

ADMITTANCE TO THE TEACHER PREPARATION PROGRAM

Students must apply to and meet the following requirements for admittance into the Teacher Preparation Program:

- An Overall GPA of at least 2.75.
- Completion of the following coursework with a grade of "C" or better in the following skill areas:
 - o Reading: Any 6 credit hours coded 060 or 070 Core Curriculum
 - Written Communication: Any 6 credit hours coded 010 Core Curriculum
 - Critical Thinking: Any 3 credit hours coded 040 Core Curriculum
 - Mathematics: Any 3 credit hours coded 020 Core Curriculum (Geography majors must take MATH 1315 or higher [excluding 1316])
 - Completion of COMM 1310 or its equivalent with a grade of "B" or better to demonstrate competency in oral communication. If a "C" is earned, students may schedule an interview with the Office of Educator Preparation to determine whether the course must be repeated
 - Junior status (60 hours completed)
 - 12 semester credit hours in subject-specific content area
 - Application to the Teacher Preparation Program
