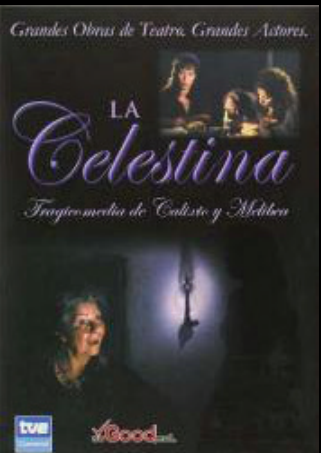

12th c. Spain is overrun by the Moors and the country's only hope rests in a heroic knight known as El Cid.

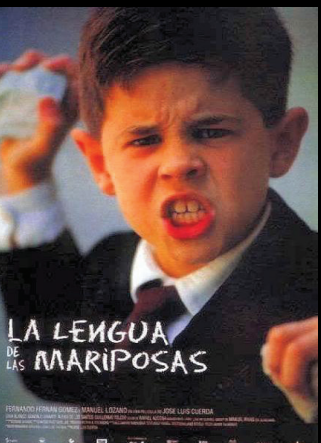
