## DEATH INVESTIGATION TIPS

<ul><li>✓ Wear personal protective equipment (PPE).</li><li>■ Gloves</li></ul>
<ul> <li>■ Mask or mask and shield</li> <li>✓ Keep a pair of shoes that you wear on death scenes and not inside your home or office.</li> <li>✓ Wash your hands!</li> </ul>
Go to the scene (if not possible, maybe someone from the scene can videochat you, so you are able to see what it looks like).
<ul> <li>✓ Check the basic environmental conditions.</li> <li>■ What was the temperature outside? Inside the house?</li> <li>■ If the deceased is found in a vehicle, is it still running or turned off?</li> <li>■ Is there medication at the scene?</li> <li>■ Is there drug paraphernalia or anything else that indicates drug use?</li> <li>■ Was there a suicide note?</li> </ul>
Interview family, friends, medical professionals, and others who might have relevant information
<ul> <li>✓ What did the deceased do for a living?</li> <li>✓ Were they have symptoms of any illness?</li> <li>■ Shortness of breath?</li> <li>■ Fever?</li> <li>■ Headaches?</li> <li>■ Stomach aches?</li> <li>■ Anything else out of the ordinary for that person?</li> <li>■ Were the symptoms new over the last few days, or weeks, or months?</li> </ul>

 Doctor's name and general location Recent hospital visits and hospital name

✓ Did they have pre-existing conditions or illnesses?

✓ Collect contact information for follow-up questions.

• Family member name and phone number

Law enforcement who was on the scene

Send the body for autopsy if necessary.

✓ Was the deceased acting out of character in the days prior to their death?
