### **Board of Regents' Review (#500)**

President's Cabinet members and guests Ms. Brandi Martinez, Staff Council Chair, Dr. Lynn Ledbetter, Faculty Senate Chair, and Mr. Jayme Blaschke, Public Information Specialist, reviewed the agenda items for the May 19-20, 2022, Board of Regents meeting.

### **Board of Regents News Release (#626)**

Mr. Blaschke reviewed possible topics for inclusion in the news release on the current Board of Regents meeting. The news release will focus on the launch of the new master's degree program in Long Term Care Administration.

### **President's Update (#556)**

President Trauth welcomed Dr. Dan Perry, who will serve as Interim Vice President for University Advancement effective June 1, 2022; Dr. Breier will stay on as Executive Director of the Texas State University Development Foundation. Dr. Perry and Dr. Breier will continue in these capacities, respectively, until a permanent replacement is hired.

### **Significant Issues (#01)**

Provost Bourgeois provided a fall 2022 enrollment update. New Student Orientation registrations for first-year student and transfer students continue to increase by double digits compared to the same time in 2021. Likewise, housing contracts continue to increase, hovering around 105 percent occupancy.

Mr. Algoe provided an update on facilities projects.

Mr. Algoe shared that the Hazlewood data published by the Texas Higher Education Coordinating Board is posted online. Texas State continues to be number two in Hazlewood recipients behind Texas A&M University.

Mr. Coryell provided an update for all spring 2022 sports and announced that the baseball team won its series versus the University of Louisiana at Lafayette, has a win-loss record of 41-11, is ranked 13<sup>th</sup> in the D1 Baseball Rankings, and has a rating percentage index of 30.

Dr. Perry reported that Texas State has had four consecutive quarters above \$6 million in gifts, surpassing their annual goal of \$25 million for fiscal year 2022.
