- Family Campaign: Dr. Barbara Breier provided the Council with an update to the Family Campaign and gave her thanks to all who were involved with the Campaign this year. Faculty participation is very high this year.

- Sexual Assault Training Requirement Implementation: Dr. Joanne Smith provided the Council with clarification on the implementation of the sexual assault training requirements. Instructions will be sent out from her office regarding these new training requirements.
- Curriculum Proposals:
 - Change the Master of Social Work major in Social Work-Administration/Supervision Practice to a major in Social Work-Administrative Leadership
 - Add a Master of Science major in Merchandising and Consumer Studies
 - Change the Bachelor of Arts majors in Mass Communication-Advertising, Mass Communication-Electronic Media, Mass Communication-Journalism, and Mass Communication-Public Relations to Bachelor of Science degrees
 - Add a Master of Fine Arts major in Theatre
 - Change the Bachelor of Science major in Geography-Water Studies to a major in Geography-Water Resources

All proposals were approved by the Council.
