## **Summary and Action Items**

- Learning Commons Update: Dr. Van Wyatt provided the Council with an update on the renovations to the Alkek Library in order to create a learning commons model and environment. Dr. Wyatt also discussed Crashplan, which is a backup computer backup solution for faculty and staff to secure their important intellectual property, data, and files. Dr. Wyatt announced that Microsoft will be ending support for the Windows XP operating system and the Microsoft Office 2003 software suite, therefore ITAC will be reducing their support of Windows XP and Office 2003 on April 8, 2014. Dr. Wyatt distributed a list to the Council identifying faculty and staff in their areas with computers using the Windows XP operating system.
- Work Life Survey Comparative Data: Dr. Roseann Mandziuk presented to the Council a comparative report of the survey of work-life issues for faculty and staff from 2004-2013.
