#### **Course Objectives:**

The purpose of this course is to learn about the process of psychological research in its various forms and to acquire the critical thinking skills necessary to read, think, and write about published research findings. After successful completion of this course, you should be able to:

- 1) Understand the ethical issues in research and know what constitutes *ethical* research.
- 2) Understand the various types of research methods used in psychology, and know when each method is most appropriate.
- 3) Properly design a psychological research project.
- 4) Read and think critically about research findings.
- 5) Interpret results and report research findings in APA format.

You are required to do the assigned reading listed on the schedule below. In addition to the textbook, we will be reading, discussing, and writing about published research articles throughout the course of the semester. These readings will be available to you on TRACS or in class.

## \*Graded Work:

## Midterm Exam (15% of overall course grade)

There will be **1 midterm exam** focused on applying the course concepts. This exam will be open note/book (no internet) and will contain applied, essay style questions.

## Assignments (25% of overall course grade)

Throughout the semester, there will be several assignments and paper rough drafts that will be graded. These should be turned in on time for full consideration (late work is only accepted when cleared with the instructor **beforehand**).

## Class Participation (20% of your overall course grade)

Some class days will involve an in-class activity/discussion on the topics covered to help you solidify your knowledge. For each activity that you actively participate in, you will earn **full credit**. If you are not in class, or do not fully participate, you will receive **no credit**.

## Research Talk Attendance (10% of your overall course grade)

You are required to attend at least 3 research talks given by the psychology department to help familiarize yourself with the research going on in the department. These can be brown bag talks (at noon in UAC 275 on 9/6, 9/20, 10/11, 10/25, 11/8, 11/22, & 12/6), job candidate talks (dates TBD), or invited speakers to the department (dates TBD).

# Research Project (30% of course grade)

The grade for your research project will have two parts: (1) an oral presentation grade and (2) a research paper grade.

# Oral Presentation of Research (10% of course grade):

Each student will have **15 minutes** to present their research project and findings, including:

- An explanation of the topic of interest, background theory, and previous research findings
- An explanation of the specific hypothesis/hypotheses
- An explanation of your Methodology including participants, design & operational definitions of variables, materials, and procedure used
- An explanation of the descriptive, graphical, and inferential statistical results
- An explanation of your interpretation of the results as they relate to your hypothesis, larger theory, and past research findings
- Thoughtful responses to questions from your instructor and peers

# Individual Research Paper (20% of course grade):

Each student must also write an APA style research paper, reporting their study. The requirements for the research paper are as follows:

- Must be written according to American Psychological Association (APA) format
- Must use at least 8 peer-reviewed (primary-source) journal articles as sources

- 8-15 pages, double-spaced, in 12 point font (not including Title Page, Abstract, or References)
- Must not contain any plagiarism

Details about and a grading rubric for the research paper and presentation will be posted on the course TRACS site.

# <u>\*NOTE:</u> some graded work will be turned in via uploading documents to TRACS. All such work must be in either Word document (.doc or .docx) or PDF (.pdf) format.

Your letter grade will be based upon your combined performance in the categories listed above, with the following grade cut-offs:
