- 11 BE IT ENACTED: That the Student Government governing documents

21 Article III - Structure

Section 1: The Student Government is comprised of three branches: Executive, Assembly, and the Judiciary

- a. The executive power is vested in the Student Body President (hereafter referred to as "President"). A Cabinet comprised of the President, Student Body Vice President (hereafter referred to as "Vice President"), Attorney General, Chief of Staff, Directors of Student Government Departments (hereafter referred to as "Departments") will assist and advise the President.

- 35 Student Government without authorization from either the House,
- 36 Senate, or Executive (Supreme Court?).

Article IV - The Executive

38 Section 2:

The Cabinet will consist of the President, Vice President, Attorney General, Chief of Staff, the Directors of Departments, and others as the Senate establishes by law. The President may authorize other ex officio members. The Cabinet will meet once weekly during the fall and spring semester at a time and location as determined by the President. The President, or designee, will serve as Chair of the Cabinet.

Section 4:

- f. Have the power to nominate students to fill vacancies in the Attorney General, Chief of Staff, Director, and judicial positions and all other positions in the judiciary and executive as those positions become established by law
- h. Have the power to appoint Department Assistant Directors from the student body to be confirmed by the—Senate

Section 7 - The Vice President will:

a. Serve as Chair of the Senate, House, and Assembly, unless the responsibilities as Chair 61 under this section are duly delegated, in 62 63 writing, by the Vice President to the House or Senate Leader or in the event either chamber or 64 the Assembly installs the Leader as Chair by a 65 Motion of No Confidence attaining a two-thirds 66 approval of the respective chamber or Assembly, 67 1) The Vice President will be removed from the 68 Chair of either chamber or the Assembly for the 69 70 remainder of the Session if the respective chamber or Assembly passes by a 71 72 two-thirds vote a "Motion of No Confidence in the Vice President." The passage of a Motion of No 73 74 Confidence expresses the view of 75 the respective chamber or Assembly that the 76 Vice President no longer has the trust of the respective chamber or Assembly or believes 77 the person cannot be effective in the performance 78 79 of their duties. A Motion of No Confidence may 80 only be properly introduced when the Vice President has exhibited any of the following: 81 conduct unbecoming of their office, 82 83 gross inability as a practitioner of 84 parliamentary procedures, is not an effective Chair, dereliction of duty, violation 85 of the Constitution or laws of 86 87 Student Government, crisis, scandal or other 88 situation; which in the view of the respective chamber or Assembly, markedly 89 restricts the Vice President's ability to 90 91 function as a legitimate leader in 92 the respective chamber or Assembly. 93 F. Temporarily yield their chair duties to the 94 respective Senate or House Leader when not in attendance for a Senate, House, or 95 Assembly meeting 96
