Esri ArcGIS Online FAQs for District Technologists

How are privacy issues handled by Esri for K-12 use of ArcGIS Online?

Esri makes software for adult users (http://www.esri.com/industries) but provides it to K12 schools and youth clubs for instructional use at no charge. We do not market to youth, period, and specifically do not want student data. We show people in this document http://esri.box.com/agoorgsforschools (see esp. p.12, 22-34) numerous strategies they can follow to ensure personally identifiable information (PII) is not used or shared. This document specifically recommends the use of "generic" logins and assignment of those logins to students. We further point out additional steps through which the school may "establish thicker and taller walls" around the school and students.

That said, we do not prohibit schools from setting up their Org in a manner that exposes PII. We provide people guidance on how to avoid it, and let schools set up processes as they desire. Some schools want their students to establish a personal digital footprint, and we do not prevent them. On the other hand, some schools say "Our students can only do whatever can be accomplished without signing in to a personal account," so we show people how they can still engage that way (http://esri.box.com/agousestrategies). We believe in education, so we tell you outright that we have no interest in and do not collect student data, and show you how to avoid using and exposing it, but the choice to follow our suggestions or not is yours.
