2017 – Current Chief Education Officer and Director of Spring Lake Education - The Meadows Center for Water and the Environment at Texas State University

I currently oversee the operations and strategic direction of an environmental education program at one of Texas State University’s six research centers. The Meadows Center resides at the culturally and naturally significant San Marcos Springs and Spring Lake. The education program provides outdoor education experiences for more than 120,000 visitors annually. 30,000 of these visitors include local and regional school children with half of these students originating from Title One schools. We operate historic glass bottom boat tours of the springs and are an iconic tourist destination in central Texas. In addition to our informal science programs, we offer a diverse array of outdoor education experiences including snorkeling, kayaking, stand up paddleboarding and night kayaking for faculty, staff, students, and the general public.
