Approve Minutes from January TSAC Meeting

There were no changes to the minutes from the January meeting. These minutes have been posted to the TSAC website.

Parking Permit Payroll Deduction Update

After discussion at the January 2021 TSAC meeting, it was decided that any requests to cancel payroll deduction for staff and faculty parking permits would be allowed. If a staff or faculty member chooses to cancel their payroll deduction and needs a parking permit before the next year's parking permits are available, they will have to purchase temporary permits or go to the Parking Services office and pay for the entire cost of the parking permit. At this time there have been three requests to cancel payroll deductions.

Intramural Field Shuttle

Stephanie Daniels presented a series of maps depicting current services routes for routes 12 and 14. Ms. Daniels then presented a map showing Route 14 with a stop near Speck Garage to accommodate the west side of campus.

Route 48 is a new route that was presented. This route would include the new west campus Speck Garage stop and the intramural fields when activities resume. Adding this route in the

evenings would serve the new intramural fields and alleviate some of the need for services like Bobcat Bobbies and TapRide in the evening on the west side of campus.

Pay by App Parking (AMP)

Pay by App parking is now available at 9 parking lots on the San Marcos campus and 9 parking lots on the Round Rock campus. These pay by app lots are at locations that already included pay and display permits. An email will be sent out to campus soon. This announcement was delayed due to the ice storm.

Game Day Revenue Report

Stephen Prentice presented the game day revenue report for the 2020 football season. There was a loss of \$884.40 for the season. The loss was less than in previous years because there was no tailgate, so less event staff was needed.

Bike Friendly Application

Stephanie Daniels updated the Council about the university's Bike Friendly University status. Texas State University was awarded a bronze designation on their first year applying. Every four years universities have the opportunity to either apply to renew their designation or apply for a new designation. This year Texas State University opted to apply to renew their bronze designation and was awarded bronze again for the next four years. In the future, the university would like to focus on new bike friendly infrastructure and apply for a higher designation.
