2015-38 TSUS: Requests to Seek Legislative Approval of Items Included in System and Component Institution Legislative Appropriation Requests and Other Items

Upon motion of Regent Amato, seconded by Regent Scott, with all Regents voting aye, it was ordered that The Texas State University System, through the Chancellor, be authorized to seek legislative approval of the following items during the 84th Legislative Session and any subsequent Special Called Sessions: Items included in the System's and component institutions' Legislative Appropriations Requests, including all exceptional items; legislation exempting TSUS from participation in the State Office of Risk Management insurance program; an amendment to the Education Code, Section 96.707, allowing the Texas Academy of Leadership in the Humanities at Lamar University to achieve funding parity with other university academies in Texas; and legislation clarifying component institutions' authority to adjust intercollegiate athletic fees with a majority vote in a student election.

PARAGRAPH 1.(15) OF CHAPTER III ON PAGES III-1 AND III-7

1. <u>ITEMS REQUIRING BOARD APPROVAL.</u>

The following items shall be submitted to the Board of Regents for approval at either a regular Board meeting or a special called Board meeting. Each item shall be presented in the form of a motion to the Board for consideration. Inconclusive, open-ended, or multifarious motions shall not be submitted to the Board.

* * *

1.(15) Proposed Legislation. Proposed legislation on behalf of the System or its Components, unless, during a legislative session, the Chancellor, after consultation with the Board Chair, determines that the best interests of the System or its Component(s) require pursuit of legislative action.

Explanation

This proposed change would enable the Chancellor to respond quickly to unforeseen events that occur during a legislative session, enabling him to take advantage of an opportunity or to prevent or otherwise mitigate a problem for the System or any of its Components; provided he consults with the Board Chair. It should be noted that under *Chapter II*, *Paragraph 4.32* and *Chapter III*, *Paragraphs 1.34* and *1.(15)*, the Board retains the right to approve proposed legislation, including legislative appropriation requests.

PARAGRAPH 2.7 OF CHAPTER V ON PAGES V-8 AND V-9

2. GENERAL.

* * *

2.7 Legislation. Any proposed legislation affecting the System, the Component, or their operations, by any employee or organization of the Component, acting in an official capacity and on behalf of the Component, shall be approved by the Component President and the Board of Regents.

Explanation

This section was apparently added to prevent employees from filing legislation without presidential and Board approval. More importantly, *Chapter II*, *Paragraph 4.32* already provides for presidential and Chancellor approval of legislation that is submitted to the Board.
