How to Declare a Minor

You must be enrolled in a college, if not make an appointment with the appropriate college advisor to do so.

- Make an appointment with your college's advisor to decide on a minor.
- Determine the minor you would like to pursue, and fill out the Degree Audit Form.
- 3. Your Advisor will then send the forms to get approved and signed by the dean of that college and by the manager of the minor. If your advisor does not provide this service you must do so. You must schedule appointments with the appropriate signature authorizer. You can find the office numbers on the Texas State website at www.txstate.edu.
- 4. Turn in the Degree Audit Form, and 3-5 days later you will have declared your minor!
