Overhauled both courses to reflect "ungrading". This is the idea of not using points or percentages to assess student learning. The focus was on the achievement of student learning outcomes and goals/objectives defined at the beginning of the semester. The change required revamping all assessments and projects in the course. Students were evaluated continuously throughout the semester and written feedback was given on all activities. Mid-term and Final individual meetings were held to discuss the student's progress and command of the subject matter and final grades were assigned by the instructor in conjunction with the student based on goals established at the beginning of the class.
