Academic Program







Purpose of the CDIS Programs

Master's Program

- Prepare graduate students to seek national certification and state licensure as speech-language pathologists (SLPs)
- 2 year program; Must be completed in person

Leveling Program

- Prepare non-degree seeking students to apply to graduate programs in SLP or AUD
- 1 year program; Must be completed in person

CDIS Leveling Students

- If your undergrad degree is in an area other than Communication Disorders, you should apply for the Leveling Program
- Successful completion of the leveling coursework DOES NOT guarantee a permanent slot in the regular two-year graduate program
- Upon completion of the leveling course work, each student SHOULD APPLY to multiple Master's programs for admission as should all students.

Why Clinical Practicum?

- Meet Certification Standards
- Exposure to client/patient populations across the lifespan from culturally and linguistically diverse backgrounds
- Gain required contact hours
 - A minimum of 400 supervised clock hours
 - o 25 observation
 - o 375 direct contact
 - o 325 must be obtained at the graduate level
 - Some hours may be simulated or via telepractice
- **On campus** 1st four semesters
- Off Campus last two semesters

- Complete four on-line training modules (24 hours) developed by the Texas Statewide Leadership for Autism (T-SLAT)
- Attend bi-weekly meetings to discuss regional, national, and international issues regarding ASD.

Summer

- ASD intervention activities
- Observation of ASD characteristics assessment of persons with ASD

- English, Spanish, Arabic, Ukranian, German, ASL.
- Mandarin, Vietnamese, and Variety of other languages
- Learn evidence-based best practices for assessment/treatment of bilingual and multilingual clients
- Project PLATICAR-collaborate with Austin Smiles; travel to El Salvador to provide cleft palate surgeries and provide requested education to speech therapists
- Attend biweekly sessions regarding assessment & intervention during the first year
- Academic Class-Evidence Based Practice in Second Language Acquisition

Fluency Concentration

- Assessment and intervention services for people who stutter (PWS) across the life-span.
- Advanced clinical and academic training for students in assessment and intervention for PWS.

Clinical:

- Clinical hours of assessment and intervention in fluency disorders.
- May participate in the <u>Comprehensive Stuttering Therapy</u> <u>Program (CSTP)</u> in the capacity of graduate student clinicians.

Academic:

 3 credit hour CDIS Seminar (5393) course with a focus on fluency disorders (Fall or Spring of second year).

VIP Concentration

First year: 2-3 meetings per long semester including:

- Advanced readings and clinical modules applicable to assessment and treatment of disorders across the lifespan
- Visits to various clinical settings that speech pathologists may work in
- Second year: Evidence based course with professor whose research addresses general speech and language differences and disorders across the lifespan.

Funding Opportunities

- Dr. Resendiz was granted a Minority Health Research and Education Grant Program
- ACCESS: Attaining Culturally sensitive Counseling Education for Speech, linguistic, and trauma-informed Services
 - The ACCESS grant aims to increase the number of graduate students from underrepresented backgrounds and provides graduate students in CDIS and Professional Counseling with additional opportunities to learn about providing trauma-informed services. Support for students at their off-campus placements includes mileage reimbursements for travel to the off-campus placement, attendance at conferences, and resources for off-campus placements.

Guam, American Samoa, the Republic of Palau, the Republic of the Marshall Islands, or

the Federated States of Micronesia.

(e) Maintain good academic standing as defined by the program and the institution
