1 A Resolution

- 2 To be known as "A Resolution calling for Stopping Coronavirus
- 3 Spread by Increasing Testing Capability," which intends to protect
- 4 the vulnerable and those with pre-existing health conditions.
- 5 WHEREAS: Texas State University has seen a rise in cases of
- 6 Coronavirus amongst the student body and despite university
- 7 administrators' Roadmap to Return plan, there still has been a
- 8 rise in cases. Although it is anticipated that there will
- 9 potentially be an increase in cases, it is crucial that this
- 10 university contain the spread.
- 11 WHEREAS: Faculty are being affected the most next to students and
- 12 there are professors and university employees who are part of the
- 13 vulnerable demographic, between the ages of 50 and 80; and
- 14 WHEREAS: The Student Health Center currently offers testing by
- 15 appointment; and
- 16 WHEREAS: Results usually take 3-4 days to generate which prompts
- 17 certain individuals to become careless; by engaging in an action
- 18 such as refusing to self-quarantine upon being tested; therefore,
- 19 **BE IT RESOLVED:** That Texas State University Student Government
- 20 urges campus administration and the Student Health Center to speed
- 21 up testing in an effort to deliver results within at most 2 days

- 22 due to its time-sensitive importance, and to slow coronavirus
- 23 spread on-campus and its surrounding areas; and
- 24 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED: During this academic term of 2020-2021,
- 25 campus administration shall review, consider, and adopt new
- 26 methods such as increasing funding for the Student Health Center,
- 27 work with state and federal agencies in rapid testing; with the
- 28 overall intention of detecting positive tests sooner amongst the
- 29 Bobcat community in order to respect the safety of San Marcos
- 30 residents; and
- 31 **BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED:** If passed, this resolution be
- 32 forwarded to the Student Body President for action.
