A Resolution -

To be entitled "The Affordable Homework Resolution" requesting

Texas State University institute a policy disallowing faculty

from making online textbook or homework access codes mandatory

for the completion of a course.

- 2 WHEREAS: The Student Government has made it a goal to provide
- 3 affordable and free textbooks to students, citing increased
- 4 academic performance for those who purchase textbooks; and
- 5 WHEREAS: The current plan would certainly help students in
- 6 classes that use traditional textbooks, however, an increasing
- 7 number of classes are requiring students to purchase costly access
- 8 codes in order to complete homework, quizzes, and even tests; and
- 9 WHEREAS: These codes are unique to one student, cannot be shared,
- 10 borrowed, or resold, and expire after a certain amount of time,
- 11 usually one year; and

- 12 WHEREAS: This has the effect of preventing students from using
- 13 cost-saving measures to purchase textbooks, forcing them to pay
- 14 full price for books that they may hardly use and an online service
- 15 that is usually unintuitive, cumbersome, and is limiting for
- 16 students who do not have ready access to a computer; and
- 17 WHEREAS: While professors should be given autonomy to teach their
- 18 classes their own way, these codes do not substantially
- 19 differentiate professors from each other and in fact have the
- 20 opposite effect of standardizing courses; and
- 21 WHEREAS: Texas State University's online service (TRACs as of the
- 22 writing of this resolution, but it is planned to be changed over
- 23 to Canvas) offers a wide array of built in homework and quiz
- 24 modules that could easily be used in place of online textbook
- 25 codes; and
- 26 WHEREAS: Most students express dissatisfaction with these online
- 27 services and do not find them worth the high price point; and
- 28 WHEREAS: It is within the power of Texas State University to set
- 29 a policy disallowing mandatory access codes for classes; and
- 30 WHEREAS: Student Government's position is that students should
- 31 have more options for purchasing textbooks and that they should be
- 32 affordable; and
- 33 BE IT RESOLVED: The University will institute a policy
- 34 disallowing professors from mandating online access codes in their
- 35 courses, codes may be "recommended" or used for extra credit, but

- 36 they may not be considered necessary to obtain an A in the class,
- 37 and this policy will be put in place by the beginning of the Fall
- 38 2020 semester, however, earlier is advised; and
- 39 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED: This legislation shall be forwarded to
- 40 the Student Body President for further action.
