#### A Resolution

To be known as "A Resolution Calling on Texas State University to Implement a Campus Safety and University Police Advisory Council," which calls on the University administration to establish a Campus Safety and University Police Advisory Council strategically positioned in order to provide authentic community engagement, policy review, informal complaint analysis, as well as research through data transparency on issues of campus safety.

- 1 WHEREAS: Student Government serves as the official voice for
- 2 students at Texas State University; and

3	WHEREAS:	The University Police Department (UPD) serves as the
4		officially recognized law enforcement on the Texas
5		State University campuses1; and
6	WHEREAS:	UPD is expected to create a high-performing, diverse
7		team, committed to the principles of community
8		policing through the demonstration of best practices
9		in university law enforcement while providing a safe
10		and inclusive learning and working
11		environment <sup>2</sup> ; and
12	WHEREAS:	UPD publicly commits to adhering to the following
13		values to guide their conduct, including Transparency
14		- availability of information for effective
15		collaboration and cooperation with our community;
16		Respect - treat everyone with dignity and compassion;
17		<pre>Integrity - uphold the highest ethical standards;</pre>
18		Innovation - create visionary solutions in the pursuit
19		of excellence <sup>3</sup> ; and
20	WHEREAS:	The Chief of Police, under the general administrative
21		direction of the University President <sup>4</sup> , is responsible
22		for and has commensurate authority to command, direct,
23		and organize the UPD; and

24	WHEREAS:	In 2014 the University of California Davis established
25		a robust independent Police Accountability Council
26		(PAB) that includes multiple undergraduate students,
27		graduate students, and staff members as voting
28		members <sup>5</sup> ; and
29	WHEREAS:	The University of California Merced has recently
30		created a Police Advisory Council of 16 members that
31		includes representation of students, faculty, and
32		staff including a reserved spot for an undocumented
33		student <sup>6</sup> ; and
34	WHEREAS:	Municipalities across the nation have adopted robust
35		oversight of police departments in order to foster a
36		more direct feedback loop between police and the
37		communities they serve; and
38	WHEREAS:	The University currently has an ad-hoc Safety and
39		Security Taskforce which touches on many of the
40		concerns noted by current Texas State Community
41		members; and
42	WHEREAS:	Texas State University Systems Rules and Regulations,
43		Chapter IV, Section 2.2(10), authorizes the University
44		President to appoint campus committees, councils, and

# Campus Safety and University Police Advisory Council

## I. PURPOSE

- A. The Campus Safety and University Police Advisory Council functions in an advisory capacity to the university and University Police Department related to issues of campus safety and police department operations. The Council should strive to work collaboratively with the Texas State University Police Department. However, the Council is not intended to act as a component of the Police Department and is situated specifically as a Presidential Council so that can provide independent oversight and objective advice and scrutinize University Police Department practices, policies, and processes. While the Council is an independent body, the Council will regularly report directly to the University President or Vice President designee. The Council will have other responsibilities and rights granted by the university which include:
  - 1. Advise university staff responsible for safety, emergency response, and university police on issues related to their area of operation.
  - 2. Conduct annual campus safety and lighting walk review.
  - 3. Serve as a liaison between the University Police Department and the University community.
  - 4. Advise and make recommendations to the President or designee concerning policy and practices of the University Police.
  - 5. Advise and make recommendations to the President or designee concerning actions of the University Police Department and officers.
  - 6. To be briefed by the Chief of Police regarding complaints of officer behavior and subsequent investigations of officers.
  - 7. Conduct campus wide survey or use other methods to assess campus and police engagement.
  - 8. To be briefed on all use of force incidents by the University Police.
  - 9. To function as a sounding board for the Chief of Police and President or designee on various issues or concerns involving the University Police.

104		10. To provide input on programs and initiatives to enhance campus safety.
105		11. To prepare an annual report of the Council's activities, which must be
106		forwarded to the University President and made public on the University
107		Police website.
108	II.	SUPPORT
109		A. The President or Vice President designee will provide financial and staff support for
110		the operations of this Council.
111	III.	COMPOSITION
112		A. The Council will consist of nine (9) members of the campus community; eight (8)
113		will serve as voting members, one (1) will serve as ex officio member. All members
114		of the Council will be appointed to two (2) year terms. All new members of the
115		Council must be accepted by the previous year's Council prior to taking a position on
116		the Council. All members of the Council must have demonstrated a commitment to
117		our University's diversity and inclusion statement.
118		B. Voting members will be composed of the primary constituent groups of the campus
119		community: 1) Students, 2) Faculty, 3) Staff, 4) Local Community:
120		1. There will be three (3) student representatives, one (1) appointed by the
121		Student Government, one (1) appointed by the Residence Hall
122		Association, and one (1) appointed by the Underrepresented Students
123		Advisory Council.
124		2. There will be two (2) faculty representatives appointed by Faculty Senate.
125		3. There will be two (2) staff representatives appointed by Staff Council.
126		4. There will be one (1) member of the local San Marcos community as
127		selected through a process outlined by the Council.
128		5. There will be one (1) non-voting and ex officio designee from UPD
129		leadership (though not the Chief of Police).
130		C. The Council will be Co-Chaired by one faculty representative and one student
131		representative as elected from within the Council.
132	IV.	OPERATING PROCEDURES

A. The Council will set its own operating procedures, policies, and processes which 133 134 cannot conflict with university police or the following standing rules of the Committee: 135 136 1. The Council will meet at least monthly during the academic year. The 137 scheduled of meetings will be developed at the beginning of each 138 academic year by the Co-chairs. 2. For the purposes of conducting the Council's business, a simple majority 139 140 of the Council's voting members must be present. 141 3. Meetings will be closed with the exception of public comment period 142 during each meeting, and any public forum events conducted by the 143 Council. 144 4. The Council will coordinate an open public forum each academic year to 145 receive campus concerns. 146 5. The Co-Chairs will meet annually with the Texas State University System 147 Board of Regents Audit and Risk Council or designee. V. ACCOUNTABILITY TO COMMUNITY 148 A. The Council will release an annual report every academic year. This report will 149 150 summarize a pertinent finding about community and police engagement, as well as clearly outline the role and impact of the Council. The Annual Report will be 151 152 intentionally shared with members of the campus community that are more impacted 153 by policing. 154 1. The Council will conduct at least one Public Forum or Town Hall style 155 event a year to hear feedback from the campus community. Public 156 meetings must be coordinated and facilitated by the Council and reflect 157 the current needs of the campus community. 158 2. The Council will facilitate and review survey data relating to the campus community's experience with the University Police. 159 160 i. This data will be collected and evaluated by the Council using 161 available university tools. 162 ii. This data will be distilled into a public report for the campus 163 community.

164	iii.	This data will then be used to inform the ways in which the
165		Council engages with members of the campus community around
166		policing.
