# A Resolution -

To be known as "A Resolution Calling on the Texas State University Police Department (UPD) to Release all UPD Incident Data since 2016," which demands that the University Police Department provide a nonconfidential release of UPD incident data collected by the department since 2016 and directing the Student Body President to issue a letter to the US Department of Education asking them to launch an official inquiry if the university fails to comply with this resolution.

- 1 WHEREAS: Student Government serves as the official voice for
- 2 students at Texas State University; and
- 3 WHEREAS: The University Police Department (UPD) serves as the
- 4 officially recognized law enforcement agency on the
- 5 Texas State University campuses1; and,
- 6 WHEREAS: UPD publicly commits to adhering to a set of values
- 7 which in part include: Transparency availability of
- 8 information for effective collaboration and

9		cooperation with our community; Integrity - uphold the
10		highest ethical standards2; and
11	WHEREAS:	In a recent article published by the Texas Tribune, it
12		was revealed that the University Police Department
13		failed to accurately report incidents on campus
14		through the Clery Act, including incidents of sexual
15		violence in and around campus; and
16	WHEREAS:	The crime statistics and public reporting on the
17		University Police Department website under the 60-day
18		Crime and Fire Log does not include all reportable
19		incidents under the Clery Act; and
20	WHEREAS:	Laws like the Clery Act are minimum federal guidelines
21		and should not be used as the only industry accepted
22		standard by which to release information to the
23		public, especially students at high risk such as
24		students attending a college or university; and
25	WHEREAS:	Texas State University prides itself on striving to be
26		better than other institutions in the state, and the
27		University Police Department includes a core value for
28		innovation; and

29	WHEREAS:	As such,	, the university administration should never
30		use exar	mples of other institutions failings to deflect
31		from our	own shortcomings; and
32	WHEREAS:	In the	interest of transparency and innovation, the
33		Universi	ity Police Department should reform the way it
34		reports	and provides information to the public on any
35		incident	that occurs on or around campus including,
36		but not	limited to, those incidents that fall under
37		the Cler	ry Act; and
38	BE IT RES	OLVED:	The Student Government at Texas State
39			University, through the advocacy of its
40			Senators and Student Body President,
41			explicitly demands that the University Police
42			Department immediately release all incident
43			information collected by the department or its
44			partners since 2016 in a similar format to the
45			60-Day Crime and Fire Log found on the UPD
46			website with information including the nature
47			of the incident, a case number if one was
48			assigned, date and time reported, date and
49			time occurred, general location, disposition,
50			and any relevant information except
51			information that may be used to identify the

52	suspect or the victim about any arrested
53	person(s); and
54 BE IT RESOLVED:	The Student Government demands this
55	information be provided to the Student Body
56	President, in a format that is not
57	confidential, within 60 days of passage or
58	provide within 60 days an estimated amount of
59	time to provide said report; and
60 BE IT RESOLVED:	The Student Government directs the Student
61	Body President to write a letter to the U.S.
62	Department of Education asking them to open an
63	official Review into the University policing
64	policies and practices, as well as the Clery
65	Act reporting processes and statistics, should
66	the University not affirmatively respond to
67	this legislation with the report or the
68	estimate within the prescribed timeframe; and
69 BE IT RESOLVED:	This legislation shall be forwarded to the
70	Student Body President for further action.
