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

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



Pursuing Your Degree Part-Time

Three-year degree plan (typically)

Importance of supportive supervisor

One internship (instead of two) when working full time in the field



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Cohort-Based Program

- Approximately 12-16 students per cohort
- Take courses together in the same sequence
- Develop strong relationships with each other & with faculty
- Bridge and integrate learning across courses
- Research demonstrates student success and retention in cohort-based models


