Preparing Jurors for Trial

Taking the Bench on Trial Day

- Introduce myself, clerk, & bailiff
- Ask for phones on silent
- Explain the case (eviction, small claims, etc.) and jurisdiction

Why?

Jurors will be more patient & be able to better pay attention if they know what to expect.

What is important to include?

- Thank the jurors for their service
- Explain how many will be chosen
- Not a court of record: video and audio recording won't happen

What else is helpful?

- Plaintiff brought the case and will go first because it's their burden
- Defendant will have a chance to respond
- Don't mingle with parties or communicate including any lawyers
 - They've been told the same thing
