## PURPOSE

1. The purpose of this policy and procedure is to establish guidelines in awarding undergraduate academic credit by examination.

## POLICIES

- 2. An unlimited number of semester hours of credit may be awarded to a student by examination.
- 3. Credit by examination does not count towards the 30 hour residency requirement.
- 4. Documentation (official test results) for credit by examination will be maintained on file in departmental office for two years from the time of graduation.
- 5. All transcript entries for credit by examinations are entered as credit (CR). No grades will be given for credit by examination if transcripted by the OWLS department.
- 6. No student will be allowed to retest in less than 6 months for CLEP exams and 90 days for DSST exams.
- 7. Credit awarded by examination will be applicable only to the Bachelor of Applied Arts and Sciences degree.
- 8. Credit by examination scores, either evaluated by the Texas State Testing Center or brought in by the student, will be reviewed for compliance with departmental regulations.

## DOCUMENTATION OF CREDIT BY EXAMINATION

9. Official test results must be used to document completion of an examination. Xerox and fax copies are not acceptable.
