The Department of Housing and Residential Life (DHRL) is a wonderful resource for students like you who are considering the options for where to live during their studies. ### Question: Should I live on or off-campus?

Because of a range of factors, TXST has a housing policy that limits eligibility to live on campus. We'll summarize it below:

TXST has a housing policy that requires new first year students under the age of 20 (by September 1 for Fall admission or January 1 for Spring admission) with fewer than 30 credit hours to live in oncampus university housing. All students who graduated from high school within the preceding 12 months of the semester of their admission are also required to live on campus.

Availability of our on-campus housing options is limited for students that do not fall under the housing policy. We urge students who are interested in living on campus to contact DHRL for more information. Their contact information is below:
