1 A Bill

- 2 To be entitled "Environmental Service Fee Act" relating to
- 3 increasing the environmental service fee from \$1 to \$3.
- 4 WHEREAS: One of Texas State's attractions is the beautiful wildlife
- 5 and scenery that defines our campus; and
- 6 WHEREAS: The Environmental Service Fee finances the Environmental
- 7 Service Committee that protects our campus environment by
- 8 allocating funds to programs like Bobcat Blend, which
- 9 provides composting research and job opportunities for
- 10 students, and invasive species removal projects that
- 11 protect our river's endangered wildlife; and
- 12 WHEREAS: With a \$1 environmental service fee, the ESC's operating
- 13 budget is obsolete and not self-sustaining for funding
- new projects to help protect the ecosystem; and
- 15 WHEREAS: Universities like the University of Texas and Texas A&M
- have a \$6 service fee, and a 2020 to 2022 Sustainability

17		Culture Assessment showed that 61% of Texas State students
18		and 60% of faculty supported the fee increase; and
19	WHEREAS:	Texas State University is one of the only universities in
20		Texas not to increase its Environmental Service Fee since
21		its establishment in 2003; and
22	WHEREAS:	As our student body experiences record-setting growth,
23		our responsibility to maintain the campus environment by
24		improving sustainability and conservation efforts must
25		increase with it; and
26	WHEREAS:	The Sustainability Committee has met extensively with
27		current Office of Sustainability Coordinator Emma
28		Parsley, ESC Chair Drake Blanchard, and members of the
29		Sustainability Student Council who all strongly encourage
30		the increase of this fee; and
31	WHEREAS:	An increase in the fee would support Texas State
32		University's environmental efforts significantly more
33		than in previous years, preventing programs from going
34		underfunded and allowing more sustainability research and
35		job opportunities to be created for students; therefore,
36	BE IT EN	ACTED: The Undergraduate Senate of the Texas State Student
37		Government supports an increase of the Environmental
38		Service Fee from \$1 to \$3 beginning in the Academic 2026-

39	2027 school year on the next full student body election
40	for a vote of the student body. As prescribed by Texas
41	Education Code §54.5111, a vote to increase the
42	Environmental Service Fee must be voted on by the student
43	body in an election that includes at least 1,000 students
44	and in which the increase is affirmed by the majority of
45	participants; and
46	BE IT FURTHER ENACTED: This bill be forwarded to the Student Body
47	President for further action.
