Types of Tenancies

- Tenant for Fixed Term
 - · Lease agreement sets out duration and terms
 - What about an oral agreement?
- Tenant at Will
 - · Consent but no set time
 - Can there be rent?
- Tenant by Sufferance
 - Previously had lawful possession, but wrongfully remain

Tenants vs Occupants vs Lodgers vs Squatters

- Occupants guests/subtenants of actual tenant
 - Have no standing, are always removed in an eviction
- Lodgers people who are temporarily staying somewhere and are not tenants
 - Can be removed without an eviction, since they have no exclusive rights to possession
- Squatters entered without permission, no claim to possession

Byrd v. Fielding

- In Byrd v. Fielding, the court drew the following distinctions between a lodger and a tenant:
 - "Proof that the owner cares for the rooms, retains a key to the rooms, or resides on the premises in the course of a business of hiring out the rooms indicates a lodging contract."
 - Proof "that the occupant exercises complete control over the rooms indicates a lease."
- Byrd v. Fielding, 238 S.W.2d 614 (Tex. Civ. App.—Amarillo 1951, no writ)

Hotels & RV Parks

- Hotels
 - Very large majority of the time dealing with lodgers
- RV parks
 - Can be lodgers or tenants depending on the facts
 - Remember that manufactured home rules don't apply
