
Program Statistics – Enrollment and Graduates


UNDERSTANDING IMPACT AND IMPROVEMENT

The primary goal of the annual report is to assess the ongoing effectiveness of educational programs.

CAHIIM is required to monitor program performance, outcomes and changes for CQI.

APAR is a proactive quality improvement process.

APAR data helps programs trend data and identify strengths and weaknesses to guide future improvements and resource allocation.
