#### **ONLINE PROCTORING**

TxState has partnered with Proctorio to provide online proctoring services that are integrated into Canvas. ONLY available for online and hybrid (INT and HYB) courses.

### WHAT IS PROCTORIO?

Proctorio is an online proctoring platform that provides identity verification, plagiarism detection tools, and content protection tools. In your canvas settings, you can build your digital toolbox to ensure your online assessment's integrity.

Common Areas Used:

- Recording Options- video, audio, screen, web traffic, desk area
- Lock Down Options- full screen, one screen, tabs, printing, clipboard, extensions, downloads, clicking, entry
- Verification Options- video, audio, desktop, ID, etc.
- In-Quiz Tools- calculator, whiteboard
- Behavior Settings- group exam, open note, navigating away, keystrokes, copy & paste, browser resize, head movement, multi-face

### ENABLE PROCTORIO

Both students and faculty must activate the Proctorio extension on their computers by following the three simple steps below.



Ensure you are using Google Chrome (if not, install) for assessment purposes. This is the designated browser to enable the Proctorio extension.



Install the Proctorio browser extension. This process only needs to be done once. The extension will update automatically.

Navigate to Canvas to start your proctored exam. Read the assessment description to prepare for proctoring requirements (video, audio, or movements).

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### **PROCTORIO OPTIONS & DESCRIPTIONS**



Recording Options		
Q	Record Video	capture video from webcam for the entire exam
Į	Record Audio	capture audio from microphone for entire exam
	Record Screen	capture text takers screen for entire exam
	Record Web Traffic	capture screenshots & URLs of any website visited during exam
	Record Desk	require test taker to show their entire exam environment at optional intervals
Lock Down Options		
	Force Full Screen	prevents access to other applications or websites during exam
1	Only 1 Screen	prevents unauthorized materials to be hidden on a second screen
	Disable New Tabs	prevent access to unauthorized material by blocking other sites during exam
	Close open Tabs	prevent access to unauthorized material by closing others webpages before exam start
	Disable Printing	prevent exam distribution by blocking print functionality
	Disable Clipboard	prevent exam material being lifted or content being brought in
<b>S</b>	Disable Extensions	prevents test takers from using other Chrome browser extensions (e.g. screenshot or location proxy) during the exam
⊥ ⊥	Block Downloads	prevent test takers from downloading files during exam and auto end session
	Clear Cache	prevent exam distribution by erasing traces of exam from computer after done

	Disable Right Click	prevents access to right click menu
$\rightarrow$	Prevent Re-entry	require exam to be completed in one sitting, end exam after disconnection
Verification Options		
<b>⊙</b> ∞	Verify Video	ensure webcam is working, pointed in the right direction, and face is visible
<b>P</b>	Verify Audio	ensure microphone is working and sounds in environment are recorded
	Verify Desktop	ensure the desktop recording is working and properly recorded
	Verify ID	require test taker to show a photo identification card before beginning the exam
	Verify Signature	requires text taker to sign an agreement before beginning exam
<b>Q</b>	Live Proctor	monitor exam in real time
	Verify Login	enters the assesment password for text takers
In-Quiz Tools		
<del>-</del> +	Calculator	option allows test takers to perform calculations using on screen calculators
	Whiteboard	allows test takers to use a scratch pad on-screen

Proctorio offers several behavior settings for customizing the level of exam monitoring: Recommended provides a balanced approach with video, audio, and screen recording; Lenient offers less stringent monitoring, while Moderate applies stricter guidelines. Other options include Group Exam, which allows collaboration, Open Note, which permits students to access notes, and Custom, where instructors can tailor specific monitoring features to their preferences.
