Syllabus

Jim Demczak vs. Roderick Wilson

Complaints received March 25th, 2025. Argued March 30th, 2025

The Court received a complaint from Mr. Jim Demczak (referred to as petitioner) alleging that Mr. Roderick Wilson (referred to as defendant) had violated Campaigning regulations as set forth by the Student Government Election Code (referred to as S.G.E.C). The complaint alleged:

1. “Rick Wilson accessed the President’s List and sent out a campaign email using their Texas State Outlook email. This was a violation of pg. 51, Section 3, Article IV, Chapter 101 of the S.G.E.C.”

The Court convened a hearing on this matter on March 30th, 2025. We analyzed the presented arguments from the petitioner and the defense, the submitted evidence, our cross examination, and the Code of Laws to make our determination on this matter.

The court holds:

1. Rick Wilson is not guilty of violating campaign regulations as found in the code.

A detailed opinion on how the court reached these determinations will be issued at a later date. This is in accordance with policy changes that the Court has incorporated a timely election certification.

Justice Downey delivered the majority opinion for a unanimous court, in which Chief Justice Hanzala, Justices Nguyen, and Hernandez joined. Justice Karki did not take part in this decision.
