Firearm display for burglary in progress. The individual was arrested without incident. No injuries were reported from parties involved. The incident was deemed to be in policy.

Firearm display for crisis intervention on rooftop, officers used tactical positioning and control hold. The individual was placed under emergency detention. No injuries were reported from parties involved. The incident was deemed to be in policy.

SMPD requested assistance during a felony traffic stop with reported stolen vehicle. Officers displayed firearms; the driver was removed from vehicle. Upon investigation the driver was the owner of the vehicle, and the owner had failed to notify police that the vehicle had been recovered. No injuries were reported from parties involved. The incident was deemed to be in policy.

UPD officers located an individual who has a CTW for campus, the individual began to be combative with officers; a taser was displayed by officers and control holds were used. The individual was taken into custody. No injuries were reported from parties involved. The incident was deemed to be in policy.

Traffic stop – vehicle began speeding to evade police, UPD ended pursuit due to foot traffic. A short time later the suspect crashed into vehicles and took off on foot. Officers were able to locate the suspect. Officers displayed a taser; the suspect continued to flee on foot and was not apprehended. No injuries were reported from parties involved. The incident was deemed to be in policy.

Officers were called to the Meadows center for an individual with a loaded firearm. Officers displayed tasers and the individual was taken into custody. No injuries were reported from parties involved. The incident was deemed to be in policy.

Officers observed security staff attempting to detain someone at the downtown square bar, officers assisted by intervening. Attempt to physically engage, working with SMPD Officers used a controlled hold and placed the individual in a wrap. No injuries were reported from parties involved. The incident was deemed to be in policy.

Assisting SMPD with a hit and run, upon arrest the individual was physically aggressive. Officers used control hold to detain individual. The individual was transported to hospital and medically cleared and taken into custody. No injuries were reported from parties involved. The incident was deemed to be in policy.
