Fall to Spring Persistence

This chart shows the fall-to-spring persistence rates for first-time, full-time undergraduate students who started at Texas State in the fall or summer and continued into the spring semester. Since Fall 2019, persistence has remained strong, with recent cohorts reaching 93%. These rates reflect the resilience of our students and the support they receive across campus. Together, we're helping Bobcats stay on track and succeed in their academic journey.


