The bachelor of music in performance provides preparation for performance and studio teaching careers as well as graduate studies in all music areas. Concentrations include classical guitar, instrumental (all standard concert ensemble instruments and strings), keyboard, and vocal as well as jazz. The optional minor in opera is available only to the vocal concentration. The optional minor in music composition can be added to any non-composition concentration.
