Experiences in Social Work

The bachelor of social work is completed in three phases. Any student may declare the social work major and is required to complete a minimum of 45 hours in a specified degree plan before submitting a formal application to the second phase. Upon successful completion of coursework in the second phase, the social work student may apply to the third and final phase, field education (internship).
