In Section 5, *¿Adónde fuiste de vacaciones?*, you will practice past tense verbs as you learn to talk about vacation destinations, trips, and travel experiences. The goal of these pages is to build your ability to communicate about leisure activities and preferences in Spanish, expanding both your vocabulary and your understanding of important cultural contexts.

Sections 4 & 5

Read-Pretérito irregular con cambio de raíz (MLO 1-5)

We will dive into the topic of Pretérito irregular con cambio de raíz, which focuses on irregular verbs in the preterite tense that undergo stem changes. Understanding this concept is crucial as many commonly used verbs in Spanish change their stems in the past tense, and mastering these patterns will significantly enhance your ability to speak and write about events that happened in the past. Key takeaways from this lesson include recognizing which verbs are affected by stem changes, how these changes occur, and how to conjugate them correctly.

In upcoming homework, you will apply these irregular conjugations by constructing sentences and describing past actions. This content will be essential for accurately expressing your experiences and storytelling in the past tense. Be sure to practice the conjugation patterns to ensure your success in using these verbs confidently.

Pretérito irregular con cambio de raíz

Read- Pretérito irregular III (MLO 1-5)

We will be focusing on Pretérito irregular III, which covers additional irregular verbs in the preterite tense. These verbs do not follow standard conjugation patterns and are essential for expressing past actions accurately in everyday Spanish. Understanding these irregular verbs is important because they are frequently used in both spoken and written language, and they allow you to describe a wide range of experiences and events. Key takeaways from this section include mastering the conjugation of irregular preterite verbs like hacer, tener, estar, and others, as well as recognizing their specific forms and how they differ from regular preterite conjugations. In upcoming homework, you will be tasked with using these irregular forms to describe events or personal experiences in the past, allowing you to practice and apply these conjugations in context. Make sure to review the conjugation rules thoroughly to gain confidence in using these verbs correctly.

Pretérito irregular III

Read- Vocab: Viajes (MLO 1-5)

In this reading, we will be exploring the vocabulary related to *Viajes* (Travel), which will expand your ability to discuss various aspects of traveling in Spanish. This vocabulary is essential for expressing ideas about transportation, destinations, accommodations, activities, and experiences that are commonly associated with trips. 

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Un viaje a España (MLO 1, 5)

In this *Práctica de aplicación: Viaje a España* activity, you will apply the travel-related vocabulary you've learned to a real-world context by watching a video about traveling by airplane. The goal of this practice is to strengthen your understanding of travel vocabulary, reinforce your knowledge of preterite and imperfect tenses, and develop your ability to discuss past experiences related to travel. This exercise is designed to help you better describe your own travel experiences and enhance your ability to use Spanish in real-life scenarios, specifically related to journeys.

Instructions

- 1. **Watch the Video:** Start by watching the video about traveling by airplane. As you watch, pay close attention to the vocabulary used to describe the travel experience, from checking in to boarding and traveling on the plane.


