Key Requirements to be a Texas State Education Abroad Ambassador

- Education Abroad Alumni: Participation in faculty-led, summer hub, exchange, or affiliated programs.
- Minimum GPA: A cumulative GPA of 2.5 at Texas State University at the time of application.
- **Volunteer Commitment:** Willingness to volunteer **at least 12 hours per semester** for the Education Abroad Office's promotional and recruitment efforts.
- **Mandatory Training:** Attend the mandatory one-hour in person session at the beginning of the semester for training, updates, and scheduling.

Recognition Level and Completion Certificates

- Maroon Ambassador: 12-15 hours per semester.
- **Gold Ambassador:** 16+ hours per semester.

Note: Certificates indicating the number of volunteered hours is awarded during the End of Semester celebration ceremony.

Opportunities for Engagement

- **Education Abroad Events:** Up to 4 hours per event (e.g., Education Abroad Fair, Ready Set Go Abroad, Bobcat Days).
- > **Presentations:** 1 hour per session (classroom/general information sessions, TXST club/resident hall presentations).
- ➤ **Peer Advising Sessions:** 1 hour per session, guiding students interested in Education Abroad programs.
- > **Tabling Sessions:** 1-2 hours per session, promoting Education Abroad Programs.
- **Poster Displays:** 1 hour per 4 posters, distributing approved posters.
