
## **How To Use Texas Legislature Online (TLO)**

## Finding a Bill:

1. Navigate <a href="https://capitol.texas.gov/">https://capitol.texas.gov/</a>




- 2. Make sure you have the right session selected under "Search Legislation".
  - a. This session = "89(R) 2025" (the special sessions have a number in the order they were called in parentheses instead of an 'R')



- 3. Choose either "Word/Phrase" or "Bill Number" depending on how you want to search.
  - a. If searching by bill number, make sure to put "SB" or "HB" (as applicable) in front of the number.



- 4. Click "Go"!
  - a. If you are searching by bill number, you will be directed to the history of the bill you searched.
  - b. If you are searching by word/phrase, you will be directed to a list of bills including the words that you searched.



## Reading the Text of a Bill:

- 1. Navigate to the bill by following the steps above.
- 2. Once you find your bill, click on the "Text" tab at the top of the "History" screen.



- 3. Select the .pdf or .doc icon next to the version of the bill that you would like to read. *Hint: For final text of the bill, choose the "Enrolled" version*.
- 4. Once you open the bill, links to statutes will be in blue, deleted text of a statute will be crossed through, and added or new text to the statute will be underlined.

   effective date of this Act if any element of the offense occurred
